SAMPLE BIOGRAPHIES

ROBERT LIVINGSTON ACKLEN, JR. was born on 24 March 1941 in Nashville, TN. He was commissioned a 2nd lieutenant in the infantry on 27 May 1967 at Texas A&M University, College Station, TX. After Helicopter Aviation School, he was assigned



to the 189th Assault Helicopter Co., 1st Avn. Bde. in Vietnam on 6 October 1968 and transferred to the 57th AHC in March, 1969. He was reassigned to the 101st Abn. Div. where he commanded "C" Co., 3rd Bn., 506th Inf. until October, 1970. Following an in-country Cobra transition, he transferred to "B" Troop, 2nd Sqd., 17th Cav. In February, 1971, he returned to the 1st Avn. Bde. and trained Vietnamese Air Force Pilots. After a helicopter crash, he was medevaced to the U.S. in June, 1971 with 33 months continuous in-country service. He spent 22 months in the hospital before returning to duty in Korea with the 2nd Inf. Div. He retired with 70% physical disability from Vietnam injuries as a captain on 30 April 1976 at Ft. Sam Houston, San Antonio, TX. His decorations include the Silver Star, Distinguished Flying Cross, Bronze Star with four "V" devices and five OCLs, Air Medal with four "V" devices and numeral 40, Purple Heart, Army Aviator Badge, two RVN Crosses of Gallantry with Gold and Silver Star. He is currently self-employed as a programmer and systems analyst residing in Dallas, TX. He is a life member of the VHPA.

CHARLES D. BROWN, enlisted in the Army in 1964 at the age of 19. His first assignment was with a Pershing Missile Battalion in Germany followed by Infantry OCS in 1966. Following OCS, Lieutenant Brown remained at Fort Benning for one year as a weapons instructor.

In Vietnam, his paratrooper unit, the 173rd Airborne Brigade, engaged in some of the bloodiest fighting of the war, to include Dak To's Hill 875 in 1967 and the 1968 Tet Offensive. Lieutenant Brown was personally awarded the Combat Infantryman's Badge, the Bronze Star



Medal and "V" Device for valorous actions, and the Purple Heart for wounds received from a Chinese Communist rifle grenade.

Captain Brown volunteered for a second Vietnam combat tour in 1970 and was a scout helicopter pilot with the 52nd Aviation Battalion in Pleiku. He logged 600 flying hours and was awarded seven Air Medals and his fifth Bronze Star Medal.

Brown served in many key positions in the U.S., Japan, and Thailand during the years following Vietnam. After 21 years of Army service and promotion to Lieutenant Colonel, he retired to pursue a civilian career. He is currently the marketing director for a defense contractor in Boston, MA.
