FROM THE COMMANDING OFFICER


This is my last opportunity to write for the WOLFGRAM and I have asked that this issue be dated and published coincident with my 14 April Change of Command. It seems fitting to summarize the activities of the past year thereby putting things in perspective.

HA(L)-3 is an exceptionally large command. During the past year I have seen about 140 officer/pilots leave and be replaced by 140 others. In the same manner about 410 enlisted men have been rotated thru the squadron. These 1100 people have each contributed of their individual talents in order to allow this command to fly over 33,000 combat flight hours during the past year. This is six times more flight time than the average flown by other air units in the Pacific Fleet, non-combat units included. Compared with all the other helicopter units in the Pacific Fleet we flew 48% of all the helicopter hours with 24% of the assets. And this was done without the many benefits which naturally accrue to a more standard Navy unit, without a Navy Department developed NATOPS program, and without a Navy Replacement Air Group for support.

During the past year we have played a significant role in the initial Cambodian Intervention, the U-Minh Forest Campaign, and now again in Cambodia. During this time we have modified our deployment in response to varying enemy threat and modified our procedures to accommodate the turnover of surface forces to the Vietnamese. We have been plagued by stabilizer bar and thrust plug failures, by engine failures, and by wide-spread fuel contamination. It's tempting to try to guess how much more could have been done without our problems but even in retrospect, it is difficult to see how we could have done more.

HA(L)-3 is an exceptional squadron due primarily to the exceptional personal qualities of the men who man it. Of course, the unique attack mission (for a helicopter squadron) combined with the combat environment are not duplicated elsewhere in the Navy, but these circumstances merely set the stage. The thing that makes the squadron outstanding is the motivation of its personnel. I have commented many times that our single biggest problem is the deleterious effect of the very short one-year tour. Lack of continuity in every command function takes a heavy toll in effectiveness. But I have also commented many times that our single biggest asset is the CAN DO and CAN DO MORE spirit of our people. This more than compensates. I leave the squadron with the deepest admiration and respect for the personnel who have served with me.

I salute every man with whom I have been privileged to serve and wish those who remain continued success.

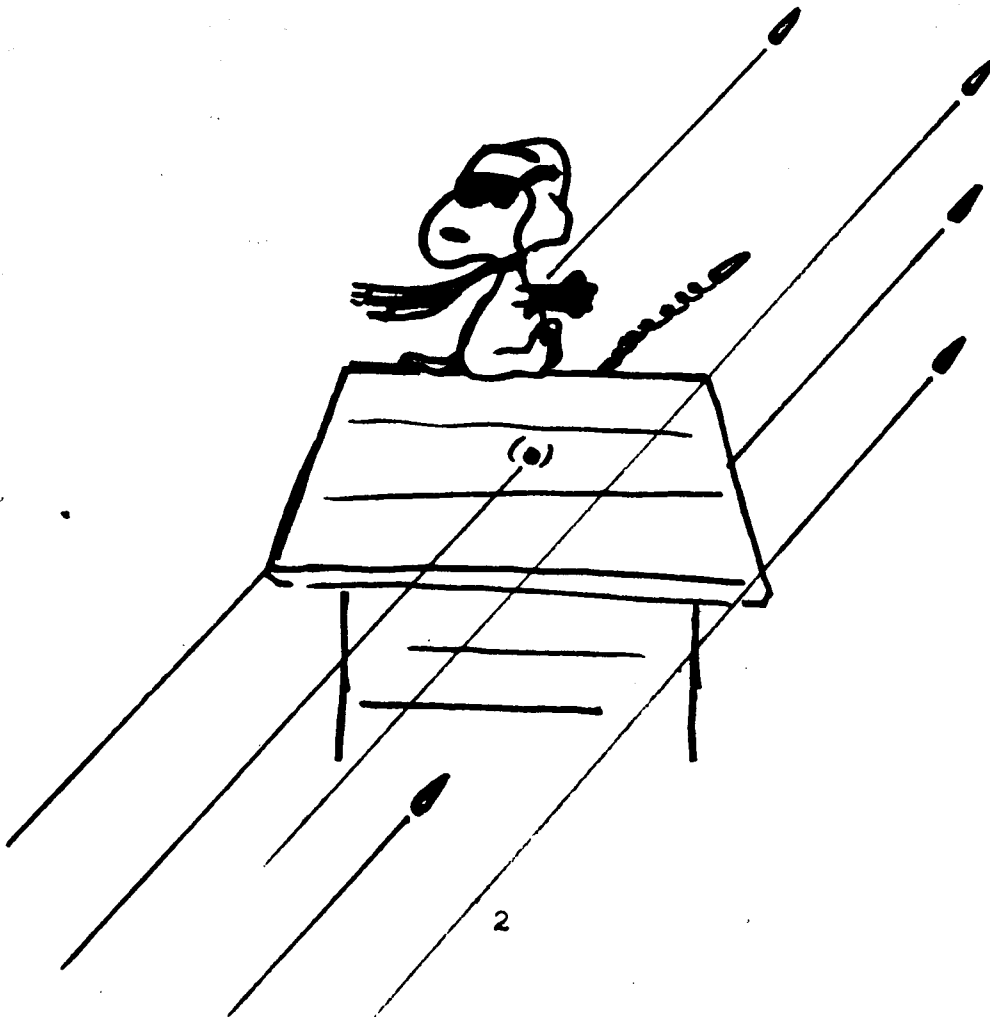
I bid one and all a fond farewell as I must return to my job of fighting this war and trying to remain awakZZZZzzzzz.

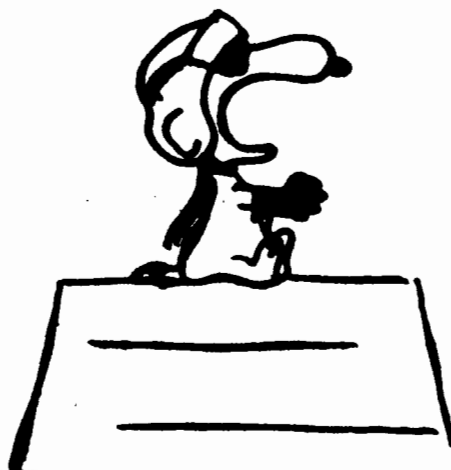

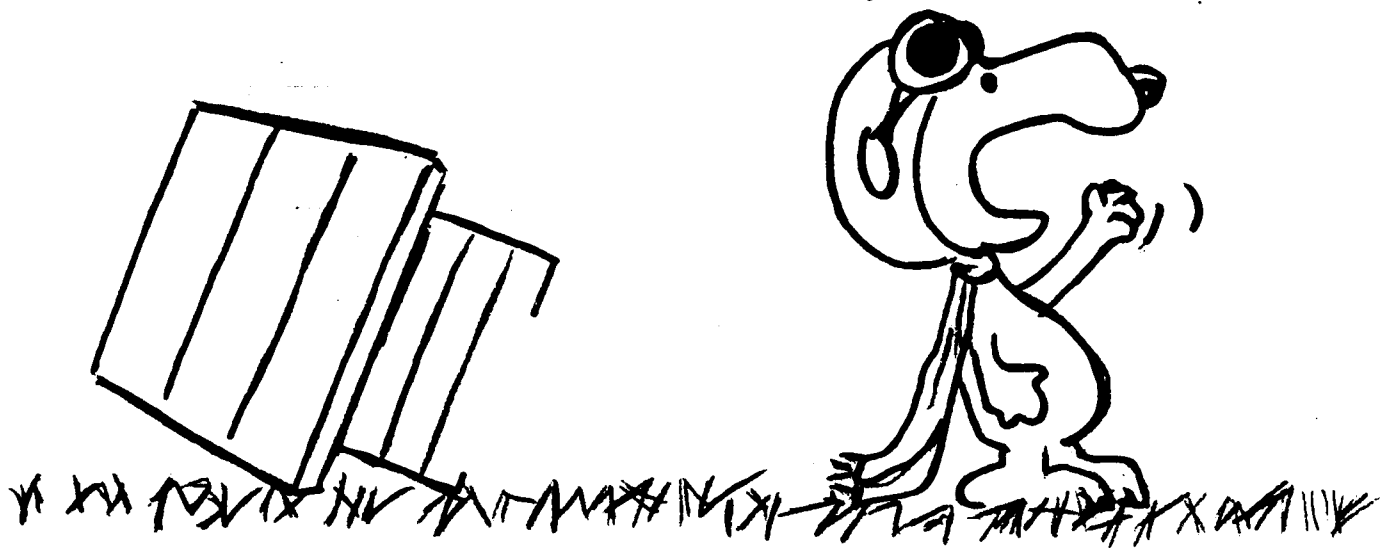

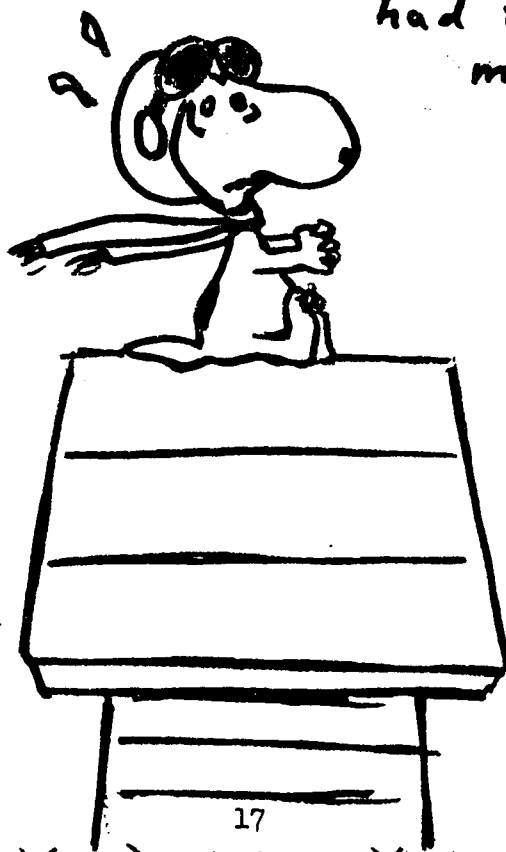

AIR FRAMES

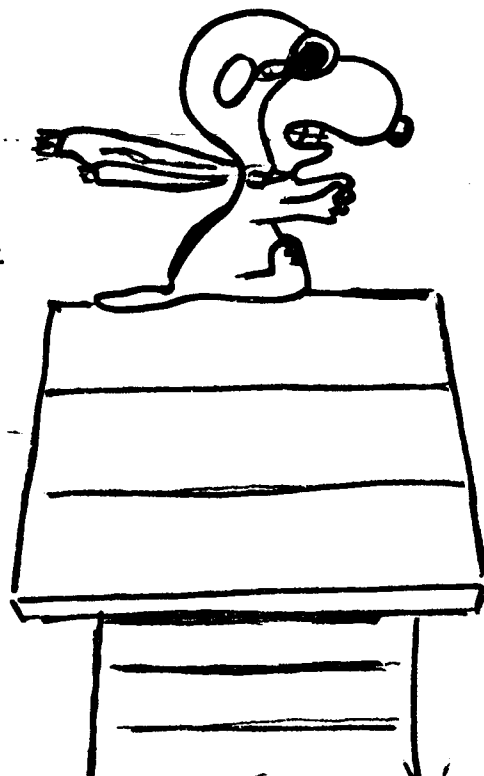

Buenos dias, from the halls of life vests, helmets, and survival radios. As this new Wolfgram period rolls around, many changes can be witnessed in the Loft.

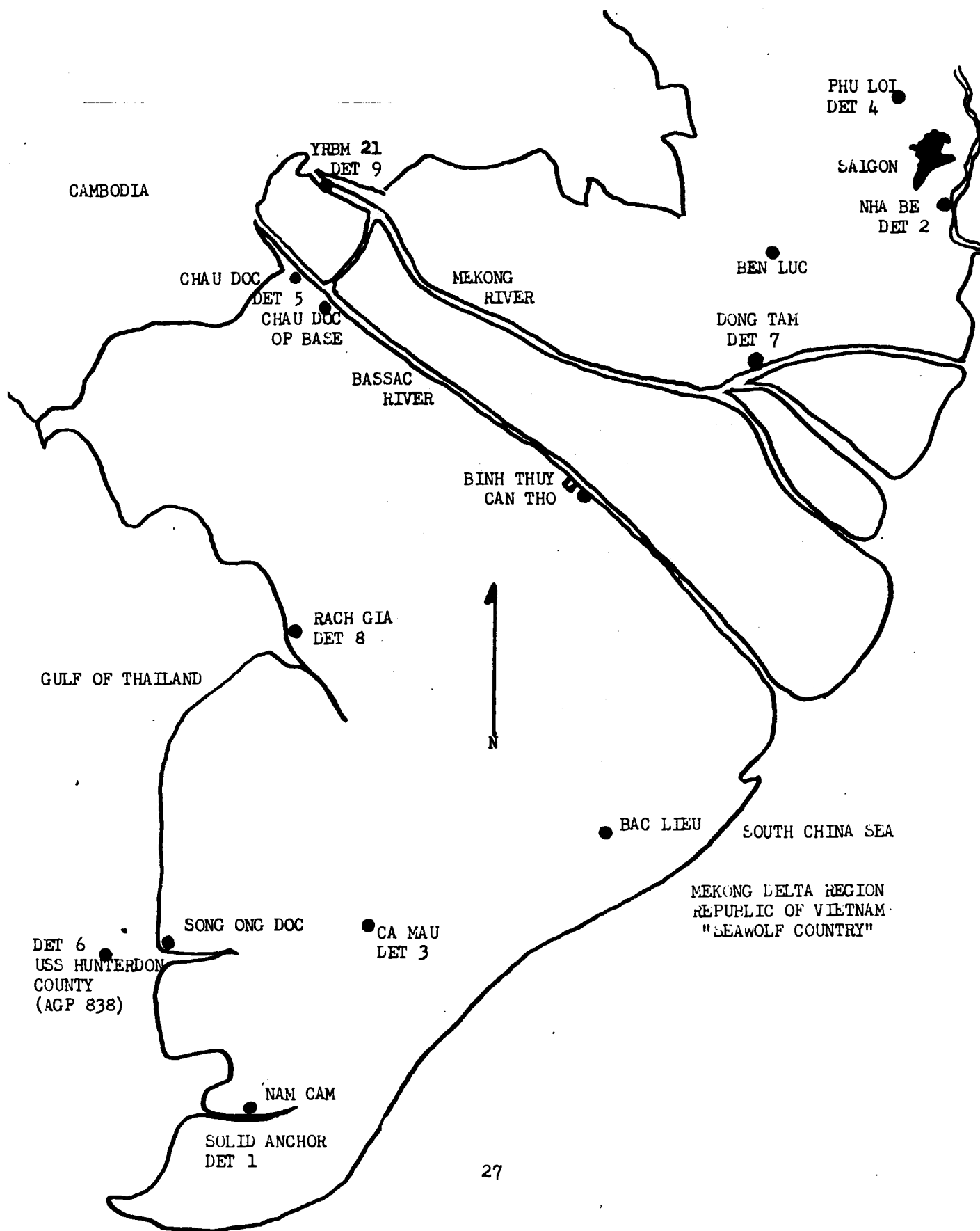
