

DET SEVEN (BINH THUY)


Well, hello out there in Seawolf land. Here we are again after a month of fun and frolic.



MAINTENANCE
CDR DEY

From the Maintenance Officer the reduction of our aircraft inventory in August stretched our capability to the elastic limit. The fluctuations in daily flight hours due to operational commitments make the programming of aircraft P.E.'s difficult at best as the sudden loss of two additional birds (without replacement) eliminated any flexibility we previously had. A quick session with a slip stick reveals the following:

Our average aircraft availability since January has been approximately 70%. Where it really hurt was when we reached 70% of 19 and there just wasn't enough aircraft to go around for all the dets. I think it significant to note that Army gunship company availability for the 1st Cavalry was 61.6% for the period. Running this figure off on the rule we got one det down for an aircraft at all times even when we have 22 aircraft aboard. Extra manhours and cannibalization have kept us above that point.

We have received the first of the three replacements. Many manhours are going into it to bring it up to Seawolf standards. The other replacements are still over the horizon.

AIRFRAMES SHOP

AMS1 SHOUN has flown south to join us after a year's tour with NAF Cam Rahn Bay. As fast as we acquired him, however, we will be losing him for 30 days R&R back in the world. AS3 JABLINSKE, from VT-28, Corpus Christi, Texas, has joined the squadron to fill the space left by the departure of AMS1 FITE to the AME shop. 
