**Officials and Entertainers Honor Victims of Communism at
Justice Day Event in Little Saigon, California**

The Vietnamese-Americans are hosting a "Justice Day for the Victims of Communism" on April 15, 2007 from 10:00 am to 6:00pm. The event is scheduled to take place at Bolsa Grande Stadium located in Orange County, California. The event aims to fundraise in support of the Victims of Communism Memorial Foundation (VOCMF). VOCMF is a non-profit organization, established by an Act of Congress to build a memorial in Washington, DC to commemorate the more than 100 million victims of communism, among those 1 million Vietnamese. VOCMF is co-hosting Justice Day with the Vietnamese-American Support Committee for the VOCMF.

The memorial site is being built on Capitol Hill at the intersection of Massachusetts Ave., N.W., New Jersey Ave., N.W., and G Street, N.W., two blocks from Union Station. The groundbreaking event took place on Sept 26, 2006 and the dedication ceremony marking the completion of the memorial will take place on June 12, 2007. The memorial is intended to honor those who successfully resisted communist tyranny; to educate current and future generations about communism's crimes against humanity; and to pay tribute to those who helped win the Cold War. Even now there are 1 billion people still living under the reign of communism, 83 million of which are Vietnamese.

Ambassadors from over 25 countries, U.S. Members of Congress and local government officials plan to be present at Justice Day to deliver remarks and participate in the day's ceremonies. Additionally, over 50 international-renown Vietnamese-American artists, musicians and groups will performing in a large entertainment show throughout the day.
