

I Understand That:

1. I cannot transfer this ration card to another individual by gift, loan, barter or sale.
2. U.S. military personnel cannot sell or barter, exchange merchandise to a member of the armed forces of any other country other than the U.S. or to a civilian of any country including the U.S. Authorized civilian exchange customers cannot sell or barter exchange merchandise to military personnel of any country. The only exception to this policy is home-fair gifts (nonessential items only) not to exceed a total of \$10.00 retail value.
3. No item (rationed or nonrationed) will be sold for a profit.
4. I am not authorized to have in my possession more than one ration card unless authorized to do so by HQ, SACV, AC-25, 31.
5. Individuals are prohibited from purchasing or possessing quantities of exchange items (rationed or nonrationed) in excess of normal consumption levels. Expressly, the possession of more than 12 cartons of cigarettes, 6 bottles of liquor, 6 bottles of wine, or 6 cases of beer is prohibited.
6. If this card is mutilated or altered in any manner, it is no longer valid.
7. This card must be turned in to the proper authority upon the bearer's rotation, termination of employment or TDY to KCM, or upon demand.
8. Failure to comply with regulations governing the use and disposition of exchange merchandise may result in disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice and/or withdrawal of exchange privileges.

VIETNAM RATION CARD

This ration card was issued to me in November of 1972, I had spent the last 18 months or so at Long Binh, RVN, which was turned over to the ARVN'S in November of 1972. I was transferred to Saigon as a member of TCF, 39th Signal Bn, USASTRATCOM-SEA, with my duty station as a Telecommunications Supervisor at the MACV TCC. When I left Vietnam for my next duty station in Bangkok, I took the ration card with me as a keep sake. I had wrote the state side address of my closest buddy on it, Bud and I were station together in Vientiane with Project 404 and at Long Binh with 1st Signal. He no longer resides there
