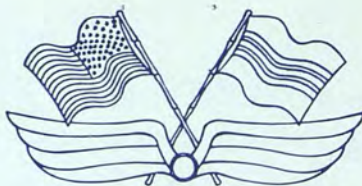

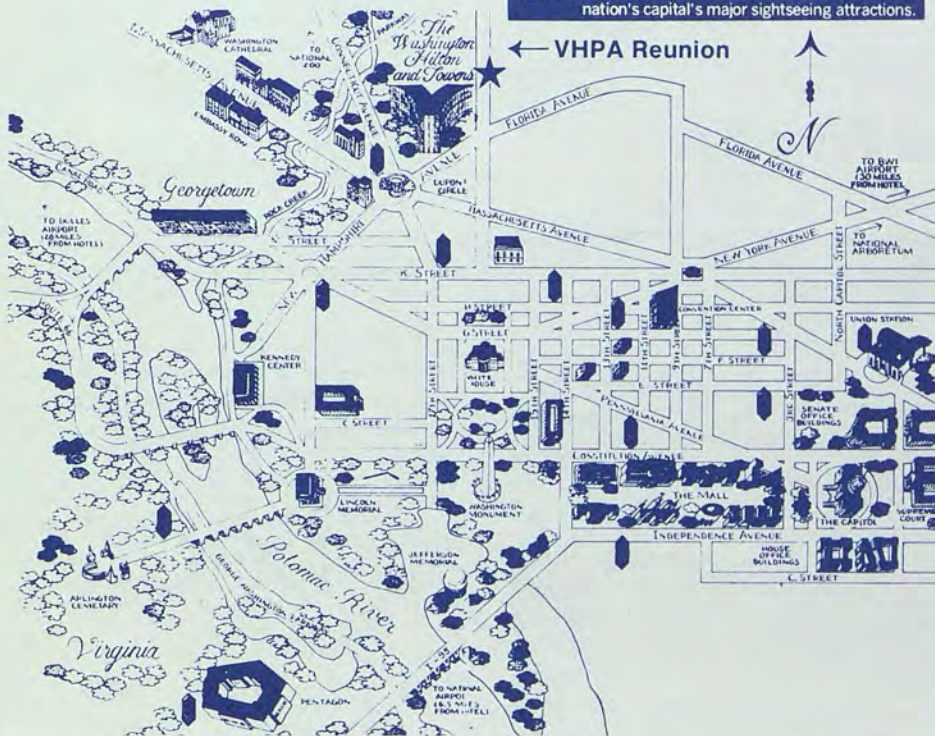
JAY ELLIOTT and his "Barn Burning" REUNION COMMITTEE have already
