SUBJ: Political Lesson for VC/NVA Cadre and Party Members. (U) 11/70

(C-May 71) (7 pages, photocopy; B-3) Training material, undated and unsigned, addressed from Tú An and Tâm Chú, Current Affairs Committee, G9, to province ((unspecified)) Party Committees and coordination and operations committees, concerns political indoctrination for cadre and Party members in Party Committees at various echelons.

The document states that friendly ((VC/NVA)) armed forces had repeatedly gained victories over the enemy ((FWMAF/RVNAF)) militarily, politically, economically, and diplomatically. The Thiệu-Ky-Huong clique had to dispatch a delegation to the ((Paris)) Conference in order to hamper the negotiations and prolong their fate ((meaning their term of service in the RVN Administration)), because once a coalition government was established, they would be excluded from this new regime.

The primary purposes of the Revolution in SVN were to liberate SVN, restore peace, and proceed towards reunification of the fatherland. Every cadre and Party member was to be confident that he was countering the US and its henchmen in their attempt to implement neo-colonialism in Vietnam. The working class was to act as the guiding element for the bourgeoisie in this Revolution ((in SVN)). Without the leadership of the working class, the bourgeoisie would cooperate with the ((US)) imperialists and betray the ((South Vietnamese)) people's rights. When evaluating a new clique, cadre and Party members were to realize that this clique would be used by the US only to suit its plans during a fixed period of time. Therefore, cadre must not pay any attention to their declarations, but only to the US schemes during each period.

In conclusion, the document states that in conjunction with the increase in military activities in the days to come, all cadre and Party members were to initiate a full-blown political struggle demanding: (1) An end to the ((Vietnam)) war; (2) restoration of peace; (3) establishment of a peace cabinet; (4) a delegation with men of good will who would properly negotiate with the NFLSVN; (5) practice of democratic freedoms; and (6) cancellation of fascist orders, such as the General Mobilization Decree, Decree 10/68, etc...
