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CAPTURED COMMUNIST DOCUMENTS INDICATE BIG OFFENSIVE IN '75

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[Text] Saigon, (VP) 1 Feb--With the intent to tear up the Paris agreement and to sabotage peace, the communist Central Office of South Vietnam (COSVN) instructed their troops and cadres to launch an all-out offensive early in 1975 which should exceed that of 1968 in intensity.

The seized communist documents revealed that the offensive should comprise two phases. The initial phase is marked with growing land grabbings, plundering of rice, and boosting of guerrilla forces into hard-core units of regiment and division levels.

In phase two, the Reds would whip up a general uprising with generalized attacks and tanks spearheading into major cities of the RVN.

From Red documents, 1975 is the year climaxing their efforts to counter the RVN pacification plan. They instructed a concentration of three kinds of forces (hard-core, regional, guerrilla) with military, political and proselyting coordination to push ahead attacks on the economic, political diplomatic fronts to "topple" the RVN.

Instruction 4-74 of COSVN issued in April 1974 ordered the bulk of military might to be spearheaded into cities and towns of the RVN, launching an armed violent campaign in the whole region under the motto: "Armed violence is the major factor at the current juncture."
