15. SUMMARY:
(C) This report contains information obtained from enemy documents captured on 12 September 1970 and concerns a notebook and recordbook. The notebook, with entries dated from 3 February 1969 to 5 September 1969, was maintained by Nguyen Van Tuy, Platoon Leader in Unit B3-C6-D12, ((NVA)) Group 967. The document contains political lessons revealing missions to be carried out by the Group ((possibly Group 967)) during the 1969-1970 dry season and notes on the personnel strength of Tuy's platoon. The recordbook, with entries dated from 19 December to 4 June ((years unspecified)), was maintained by an unidentified member of an unspecified ((NVA)) truck battalion and records the duties assigned to C1, C2, C3 and C4 ((possibly Truck Companies)). This document was captured with others referring to the 56th Truck Transportation Battalion, Military Station #4, NVA Group 559.

In the appeal made on 3 Nov 68, Uncle Hô said: "We must continue to fight until the last aggressor falls."

Answer to Question 3:

Our army was organized on 22 Dec 44, ((during a meeting held)) at the foot of a banyan tree in Tân Trào, in a forest situated between the Hoàng Hoa Thám and Trần Hưng Đạo Cantons, Nguyễn Bình District, Cao Bằng Province.

We won the historic Điện Biên Phủ Battle, killing 16,200 enemy (including General Đờ Cát Tô Rí ((possibly De Castri)) and all of his staff).

Answer to Question 4:

Golden papers for merit have been awarded to:

First: Quảng Bình, 569 papers.

Second: Nghê An, 454 papers.

Third : Thanh Hoá, 274 papers.

Fourth: Hà Nội, 258 papers.

ANSWERS TO QUESTIONS

Answer to Question 1:

Our Party was established and unified on 3 Feb 30 in Hông Kông, China, by Comrade Nguyễn Ai Quốc ((HỒ Chí Minh)) on behalf of all Communist countries. It was first called the Vietnamese Communist Party, and in Oct 30 it was designated the Indochinese Communist Party. In 1951, the 2nd Congress of Delegates of the Vietnamese People redesignated it the Vietnam Labor Party.

28 May ((69)):

Recapitulation of the achievements gained by the squads during May ((69)):

The personnel had an authoritative manner when implementing the civilian proselyting task.

Recapitulation report on the emulation phase in May ((69)):

A7 ((7th Squad)) provided six man-days for the company and spent six man-days hauling rice for the people; built one latrine and repaired two; built or repaired three urinals; constructed five partitions; repaired 40 meters of road; hauled 11 loads of water (22 cans of 18 liters each) and eight loads of manure; constructed two shelves for bowls; and wrote a newspaper article.

Outstanding emulators were Thđ (classified A) and Vach (B),

A8 ((8th Squad)) provided nine man-days for unit tasks, one man-day for helping civilians, and seven man-days in harvesting rice. Unit members constructed and repaired three latrine pits and three urinals and made two shelves for storing bags.

Outstanding Emulators were Van, Lai (classified A), and Xau (B).

A9 ((9th Squad)) provided 11 man-days for unit tasks, seven man-days for the company and civilian proselyting tasks; built three latrines, two urinals, and two shelves for storing bags; and published two newspapers.

Outstanding Emulators were Khanh and Dung (Classified A) and Son and Quãn (B). Van from A8 was classified as category one and Dung category two.

By doing so we can improve their revolutionary ethics, eliminate individualism, and help cadre, soldiers, and Party members in units to continuously make great progress and accomplish missions assigned them by the Party, Uncle HỒ, and the ((Liberation)) Army.

First, we must motivate cadre and troops to fulfill their tasks and improve and strengthen their units in all respects. Thus they will be able to quickly return to the battlefield of Đoan ((Group)), fight the enemy, carry out missions, and obtain glorious achievements. Furthermore, we must imbue all comrades with Communist ideals, revolutionary ethics, and a sound philosophy of life.

We should improve the following points:

1. Strengthen the will to fight to defeat the American aggressors, and properly observe the Party's policy line and higher echelons' orders.
2. Enhance the sense of organization and discipline.
3. Improve the proletariat viewpoint, solidify relations with the people, and respect the rights of the people.

4. Enthusiastically participate in indoctrination: Political, military, professional, cultural, etc ... ((sic)).

5. Display revolutionary cadre's virtues such as economy, dedication, impartiality, simplicity, modesty, etc ... ((sic)).

We should correct the following errors:

1. Discouragement in the face of hardships, difficulties, and the fierceness of war; desertion, shirking duties, and involvement in corruption, waste, and luxury.

2. Greedily seeking fame, wealth, position, and power, and demanding special treatment.

3. Showing haughty contempt for collectivity and the people, and having dogmatic and autocratic attitudes.

4. Setting oneself apart from the people and reality, and creating bureaucracy.

5. Not having a progressive spirit and refusing to make progress through indoctrination.

6. An undermining of solidarity, sense of organization, discipline and responsibility.

A. Questions

1. Why should our army study ((politics)) and enhance revolutionary ethics?

Being the Revolutionary Army and the People's Army, our army must fight the enemy to protect the working class and the people's interests.

Revolutionary ethics bring about revolutionary action. (Chairman Ho said: "Only by having socialists can we built socialism.") What are revolutionary ethics? ((Indoctrination)) cadre should use units as examples to show proper, ethical conduct of revolutionary soldiers. (Three hours of indoctrination).

2. Why must we eliminate individualism? What is individualism?

((Indoctrination)) cadre should be briefed on the contents of indoctrination material.

What is the source of individualism?

((Indoctrination)) cadre should point out their own indications of individualism and reasons why they have acted individualistically. (Three hours for indoctrination).

B. Collection of Opinions.

Collection of opinions and answers to questions (four hours).

C. Method of Implementation.

1. After the discussion of these matters, cell leaders must ask all comrades' opinions on each matter. They must observe whether their arguments are good, fair, or poor. Finally, cell leaders must summarize all opinions and draw a conclusion on these matters.

Plan for correcting errors.

Cell leaders of squads, platoons and companies should correct errors of members individually.
