✓ Quang Nam Battle

[Text] Hanoi VNA June 13--The South Viet Nam PLAF in Quang Nam Province in an 8-hour battle yesterday killed and wounded many GI's of the 196th Brigade from the U.S. Americal Division in Hiep Duc area, according to Western reports. The same day, the PLAF attacked Pak Jung Hi troops near Hoi An, capital of Quang Nam Province, while the PLAF in Binh Dinh intercepted Pak Jung Hi troops near Phu Cat township, damaging an enemy jeep.

On the night of June 12 and early today, the PLAF shelled many enemy positions across South Viet Nam. The U.S. Command in Saigon admitted 35 target were hit.

[Text] South Viet Nam June 15 GPA--The P.L.A.F. in Thua Thien Province on June 10 repeatedly attacked series of U.S.-puppet positions along the coast.

In the narrow Phu Loc coastal plain alone, the P.L.A.F. attacked the enemy in eight places, overrunning the Phu Loc district town and heavily damaging three artillery sites north of the Hai Van pass (sea and clouds), killing hundreds of enemy troops and cutting off the highway there for 2 days. In the Phu Loc district town the P.L.A.F. destroyed all the enemy pillboxes and bunkers, and killed hundreds of "civil guards," policemen and "pacification" agents.

On the nights of June 3 and 6, attacked the puppet forces in Nghia Hanh and Binh Son district towns, Quang Ngai Province, the P.L.A.F. inflicted 120 casualties on the enemy, including one "pacification" team wiped out; shot down two aircraft and destroyed three howitzers.

In the high plateaux, in the first 10 days of June, guerrillas in the provinces of Gia Lai, Kontum and Dac Lac attacked the enemy in many "strategic hamlets," the A-re-a airfield near the Pleiku provincial capital and on highway 14 and 19 and in the Kontum provincial capital, knocking down 120 enemy troops and wrecking 11 military vehicles.

In the Thuong Duc military sector (Quang Nam Province) from June 3 to 8 the P.L.A.F. put out of action more than 100 enemy troops and brought down one aircraft.

Besides, in Hiep Duc, same province from June 7 to 10, the P.L.A.F. wiped out more than 200 enemy troops, including 95 GI's of the U.S. 196th brigade, Americal Division, and shot down two planes.

In Binh Dinh Province on June 5 and 6, the P.L.A.F. repeatedly intercepted the enemy airforces, supporting the enemy "pacification" operation in Phu My district, bringing down 15 aircraft.

Additional reports said that in the attack on the militia officers' training center in Go Tram area on the night of June 3, the P.L.A.F. killed 300 cadets.

On the same night, the P.L.A.F. wiped out 160 enemy troops in An Nhon, Phu Cat and Phu My districts. At the same time, the enemy in the areas of Cau River, Tuy An and Cung Son and the Tuy Hoa provincial capital in Phu Yen Province took 120 casualties and lost 11 military vehicles.

On the night of June 3 and on June 6, guerrillas in Dien Khanh and Ninh Hoa districts (Khanh Hoa Province) attacked the enemy in Dien Khanh township and along highway 21, killing 70 of them and wrecking six military [?vehicles].

On the 8 the P.L.A.F. in Tuy Hoa Province twice attacked the Tanh Linh military sector and the airfields in this area, inflicting more than 230 casualties, including more than 50 GI's; destroying six military vehicles and set ablaze four depots.

According to additional reports, the P.L.A.F. in My Tho, An Giang and Kien Phong provinces on the nights of June 2 and 6 attacked many enemy positions and bases such as the My Tho provincial capital, the military bases and military training centers in Tan Hiep, Cai Lay, Vinh Kim and Binh Duc areas, (My Tho Province), Vinh Trung, Ba Xoai, Nui Dat and Tri Ton areas, (An Giang Province), and My An and Doc Binh Kieu areas (Kien Phong Province) and 30 other positions and posts, putting out of combat more than 1,300 enemy troops, shooting down four aircraft, destroying four howitzers and setting afire four ammo dumps.

In the 10 days ending June 4, guerrillas in Soc Trang Province put out of action 410 enemy troops, shot down or destroyed on the ground 4 (seven) [figure, confirmation as received] aircraft, wrecked 11 military vehicles and set afire 650,000 litres of gasoline.

In Rach Gia Province from May 25 to June 4 the P.L.A.F. in Kien Luong district wiped out 142 enemy troops, brought down or destroyed on the ground six planes and set ablaze one fuel depot.

Last May, 1,100 enemy troops were put out of combat in Tay Ninh Province 50 military vehicles, including 49 tanks and armoured cars were destroyed and five aircraft shot down by guerrillas and regional forces in this province.

[Text] South Vietnam June 16 GPA--The PLAF last May attacked the enemy without let-up in the provinces of Phu Yen, Khanh Hoa, Thu Duc-Long Thanh, Ben Tre, Soc Trang and Can Tho, causing heavy losses to the enemy.

SOUTH VIETNAM

In Phu Yen Province, the PLAF wiped out or captured nearly 750 enemy troops, including 370 GI's and satellite mercenaries; destroyed 14 aircraft, 32 military vehicles and two ammunition dumps.

In Khanh Hoa Province, the PLAF put out of action nearly 900 U.S., puppet and satellite troops, destroyed 10 planes, 39 military vehicles, five storage areas, set ablaze or exploded 500 tons of ammunition and more than 8.1 million litres of gasoline and sank one cargo ship of over 10,000 tons.

In Thu Duc-Long Thanh Province, 880 enemy troops, including 323 Thai mercenaries were put out of combat; 25 military vehicles wrecked; 10 aircraft brought down; 16 vessels sunk or set ablaze.

The PLAF in Ben Tre Province inflicted 4,220 casualties on the enemy shot down 10 planes, demolished 16 military vehicles and sank two ships.

In Soc Trang Province, the PLAF knocked out more than 2,020 enemy troops, brought down or destroyed on the ground eight aircraft, set afire 650 litres of fuel and seized 112 firearms.

From April 30 to June 5, the PLAF in Long My district, Can Tho Province wiped out 900 enemy troops.

✓ U.S. Unit Shelled

[Text] Hanoi VNA June 16--According to Western reports the South Vietnam P.L.A.F. last night shelled many enemy bases and positions everywhere in South Vietnam, including the headquarters of the U.S. First Air Cavalry Division, one of the U.S. units that have sent troops to invade Cambodia.

On June 15, the P.L.A.F. in Quang Nam Province attacked troops of the U.S. First Marine Division 30 kilometres southeast of Da Nang. The P.L.A.F. in Quang Tri intercepted troops of the U.S. 101st Paratroop Division in Huong Hoa area. The same day, the P.L.A.F. in Gia Dinh Province near Saigon intercepted at three places a convoy ferrying military equipment on the Long Tau River. One of these places was 17 kilometres southeast of Saigon. The U.S. command admitted that one of these ships was damaged.

✓ CIVILIANS SUFFER IN ATTACKS BY ALLIED FORCES

[Text] South Vietnam June 15 GPA--U.S. and Saigon puppet troops from September 28, 1969 to March 28, 1970, repeatedly attacked Khanh Lam village in Ca Mau Province [with] bombs, toxic chemicals and ground raids, killing or wounding 510 people, heavily affecting 2,400 persons and torturing or taking away hundreds of others.
