LIBERATION PRESS AGENCY (Clandestine) in English to East Europe and the Far East

[Text] South Viet Nam June 17--In the early days of June the P.L.A.F. continued their attacks on the U.S.-puppets throughout South Viet Nam. In Quang Ngai Province on June 6 the P.L.A.F. attacked the enemy south of Nghia Hanh district town, and one position in Binh Son district, putting out of action nearly 100 enemy troops.

On June 3, 4, and 5, guerrillas in Phu My and Tuy Phuoc districts, Binh Dinh Province, wiped out nearly 50 enemy troops and wrecked three military vehicles. From May 25 to June 8, the regional forces in Ninh Thuan Province attacked the enemy in various places, putting out of combat 134 enemy troops including 35 G.I.'s and Pak Jung hi mercenaries, shot down nine aircraft and damaged 19 others.

In My Tho Province, from June 4 to 9 the puppet Seven Division's base camp in Binh Duc area, the Tan Hiep military training centre, the military sub-sectors of An Huu, Vinh Kim, and Tan Hiep were assaulted by the P.L.A.F. At the same time, elements of the puppet Seventh Division were intercepted while raiding along the Ba Rai River, losing nearly 1,100 men, 17 military vehicles, four fuel depots and more than 100 firearms.

From the night of June 7 to 11, the P.L.A.F. in Ca Mau Province knocked out of action 330 enemy troops during an attack on the Thoi Binh military sub-sector and the nearby posts, and on enemy reinforcements. According to incomplete reports, the P.L.A.F. in the central part of central Viet Nam last May launched attacks on nine cities and provincial capitals, 27 district towns and military sub-sectors, 40 H.Q.'s, airfields and storage complexes inflicting over 19,500 casualties including 5,850 American and satellite troops. They also overran the enemy bases in three district towns and the military sub-sectors of Que Son, Hiep Duc, and Thuong Duc, shot down or destroyed on the ground 487 planes, destroyed 350 military vehicles, nearly 140 firearms of various kinds and 39 depots.

The people and armed forces in central Nam Bo (the Mekong delta) from June 1969 to June 1970 killed or wounded more than 75,000 U.S. and puppet troops, brought down or destroyed on the ground 450 aircraft, sank or set ablaze 290 war vessels, and destroyed more than 1,000 military vehicles, and 65 ammunition depots.

✓ 'Flurry of Attacks'

[Text] Hanoi VNA June 16--In a flurry of attacks on enemy positions in Thoi Inh military sub-sector from June 8 to 11, the armed forces and people in Ca Mau Province killed or wounded nearly 330 enemy troops, according to GPA.

In terms of units they wiped out one battalion and heavily trounced one other of the puppet 32nd regiment.

In close coordination with the armed forces, the local population rose up, destroyed many "strategic hamlets", punished cruel agents of the enemy and established the people's power.

On June 12, the liberation forces intercepted one enemy company raiding Vinh Thuan area. They neatly wiped out this company, and captured 20 firearms and a large quantity of other military equipment.

In Kien Phong Province, guerrillas and regional forces on June 10 knocked out one enemy squad in Binh Hang Trung village.

In My Tho Province, on June 3 and 4, the regional forces and guerrillas put out of action 78 enemy troops and caused the disbandment of four "civilian defense" teams.

✓ 'Puppets' Intercepted

[Text] Hanoi VNA June 17--Intercepting a puppet battalion supported by artillery and aircraft raiding south of Nghia Hanh district, Quang Ngai Province, the liberation forces on June 6 killed or wounded 80 enemy troops, seized a quantity of weapons and shot down one plane, according to GPA.

The same day, the liberation forces attacked an enemy position in Doi Chua area, Binh Son district, putting out of action one platoon.

On the high plateaux, in the week ending June 10, the P.L.A.F. wiped out 113 enemy troops, including 50 G.I.'s, shot down four helicopters and seized 11 firearms. They destroyed two signal stations.

In the first 10 days of June, guerrillas and regional forces of Ninh Thuan Province killed, injured or captured 134 enemies, including 35 G.I.'s and Pak Jung hi mercenaries, and shot down nine war planes.

In the Mekong delta province of My Tho, on the night of June 8, the liberation forces attacked by surprise the 3rd Battalion, 11th Regiment, puppet 7th Division in Ba Rai hamlet, heavily trouncing one company. The following day they decimated the Fourth Battalion of the same regiment sent in as reinforcements.

GPA quoted initial reports as saying that from June 4 to 9, the liberation forces in the province wiped out or captured nearly 1,100 enemy troops. In terms of units they wiped out two enemy companies, and heavily trounced two battalions and three companies. In addition, the liberation forces set fire to four ammo or fuel dumps, destroyed 17 military vehicles and one mortar site, and shot down one helicopter.

Further GPA reports said that in their counter attack on elements of the U.S. 199th Infantry Brigade raiding Suoi Vong area, Long An Province, the regional forces on June 4 killed or wounded 25 G.I.'s.
