SUBJ: Security Activities, VC Quang Đà Province Party Committee, VC Region 5. (U)

(U) Item 1: (2 pages, handwritten; B-3) Directive, dated 5 Aug 70, signed by 6 ((Sáu)) Phước for C50 ((possibly Current Affairs Committee, VC Quang Đà Province Party Committee, VC Region 5)), addressed to BH3100; BH3200; BH3300; BH3400; BH2600; BH2700; and BH3000 ((possibly Hội An City; Duy Xuyên District; Điện Bàn District; Đại Lộc District; Precincts 2 and 3 of Đà Nẵng City; and area 3 respectively, of VC Quang Đà Province)), orders the addressees to select 51 cadre to attend the 4th 45-day Elementary Political Indoctrination Course to begin on 5 Sep 70.

The selected cadre were to report to Sister Huong's ((liaison)) station to be guided to the training site no later than 4 Sep 70.

(U) Item 2: (7 pages, typewritten and handwritten; B-3) Directive 180/VP/TC, dated 20 Oct 69, prepared for the signature of Hoang Văn Lai for A45 ((possibly Security Section, VC Quang Đà Province Party Committee, VC Region 5)), provides instructions on developing armed security forces and strengthening security sections at various levels during late 1969.

The document states that because the security sections were assigned to protect the friendly ((VC/NVA)) elements, attention was to be paid to strengthening the armed security forces. As of the end of 1969, B3 ((possibly an element of A45)) and each security section of the 1st, 2nd, and 3rd Precincts of ((Đà Nẵng City)) were to recruit two to five security agents with legal and illegal status, and 30 to 50 secret reconnaissance agents. They were to plant six agents in enemy ((RVN)) organizations. Each h5 ((possibly district security section)) was to recruit 30 secret reconnaissance agents in urban areas; and Điện Bàn District Security Section was to plant three agents in the enemy police force, Quốc Dân Đảng ((the Vietnamese Nationalist Party)), and Catholic organizations. The security sections at district levels and higher were to place major emphasis on the strengthening of security sections at village and hamlet levels, and the establishment of espionage networks to follow the enemy's political and military situation.
