15. SUMMARY:

(C) This report contains information obtained from an enemy document and concerns a letter prepared by Cong Nhan ((possibly of an element of Dien Ban District Party Committee, VC Quang Da Province, VC Region 5)). The letter, dated 2 October 1970, directs various subordinate units to prepare for the second activity phase of ((Campaign)) K750 by working out combat plans, providing close supervision of personnel, attacking selected objectives ((unspecified)) and harassing the enemy with shellings. The purpose of this phase was to disintegrate the enemy ((GVN)) accelerated pacification program and to disrupt the Phuong Hoang Dong Tien 2 ((Intelligence Campaign)).

MISSION ORDER

TO: District Party Committee members, Current Affairs Committee members, local Party Committee echelons, sections, and branches.

The missions and requirements of the first phase of Campaign K750, a climaxing phase, are many. The Current Affairs Committee has given directives for activities and combat orders, which are now supplemented with the following items:

Our district is a major battlefield where the enemy is trying to carry out his pacification program and his Phuồng Hoàng Đống Tiến 2 Campaign to complete the last part of the six-month pacification program in September and October. To complete this plan, the enemy, in joint action with ROK troops, has recently increased the number of operations, establishing more blocking points, and has increased his artillery activities and airstrikes on coastal villages.

We are facing great difficulties in movement, messing and billeting, water transportation, evacuation of wounded soldiers, and bivouacking, caused by the floods, rain, and especially enemy activities.

However, we have the following advantages: Our cadre, Party members, Group members and guerrillas have completed a political reorientation course and in some areas, political motivation of the people has been conducted. Our men thoroughly understand the provisions of Resolution 6 of the Special Region Party Committee and are aware of our victories. Our Foreign Department has recently introduced new proposals at the Paris Conference, and the eight-point peace proposal made by Mrs. Binh has shown our victorious situation.

Dear Comrades,

In the new situation and with new determination, it is certain that we will achieve new victories as soon as we begin the phase of activities.

The movement has recently made a new turn. Activities, especially military, have been successfully carried out in a number of areas. Party Committee echelons have concentrated their exact and effective leadership on major missions concerning the destruction of the enemy's oppressive control, and fought with the enemy for control of the people. These actions have brought about results which, while not as great as we had hoped for, have proved the effectiveness of our political reorientation.

While reviewing the implementation of the directive concerning preparation for the second activity phase of Campaign K750 and the activity plan and decisions sent to us by local areas and units, we have noted the new efforts and progress made by our men. They have been much concerned with their missions and Party Committee echelons have concentrated their efforts on leadership. The Current Affairs Committee has confidence in this activity phase, but we must try to overcome difficulties. We should have a well prepared activity plan and effective implementative methods. Close coordination should be brought about on the battlefield and strong attacks should be conducted against all designated objectives. If we cannot wipe out the enemy, we should

wear him down by conducting harassing attacks or shelling against him. To support the general battlefield, our forces in the assigned objectives should be active; they should try to gain the initiative in attacks to oppress the enemy. Concerning objectives that we have not yet overrun, or combat plans that we have not yet executed, we must implement these in the activity phase. We should not stay inactive but should carry out attacks and uprisings on a constant basis.

During the period of the floods, we encountered many difficulties, but in compensation, we were offered many chances to wipe out the enemy when he concentrated his troops, leaving many weakly defended areas. If we can overcome difficulties and hardships, it is certain that we will fulfill the requirements. The flood has suspended our activities. Therefore, we cannot wait for directives and orders ((from higher echelon)). We should continue our activities in preparation for the activity phase.

This letter is to supplement the directive and order for activity previously sent. You are requested to carefully study it so that you can provide effective leadership.
