(C-Oct 70) Item 1: (1 page, typewritten; B-3) Circular 24 CV/BT, undated, prepared for the signature of Mui Khang ((aka NVA General Hoang Van Thai)) Headquarters, SVNLA, addressed to all subordinate units and agencies, informs them that the people and military forces of Binh Tuy Province are to be congratulated for killing the Commanding Officer of the 199th US Brigade in Tanh Linh.

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Document also orders all friendly ((VC/NVA)) forces of the local province to continue to kill enemy personnel and expand their control of the local areas.

This circular was reproduced by Nguyen Tho, Office of Binh Tan ((possibly aka Binh Tuy)) Province Party Committee, ((VC Region 6)), on 10 Apr 70, and was addressed to all subordinate units and agencies, stating that they were to spread the news to all cadre, troops, and the people in order to motivate them to make greater efforts to wear down the enemy; to disrupt his accelerated pacification program; to expand friendly control of the local areas; and to strengthen all forces. It was also mandatory to indoctrinate cadre, troops, and the people in the rear areas to realize friendly victories; to increase farm production; to expand guerrilla warfare; and to counter enemy sweep operations to support the front line.

(C-Oct 70) Item 2: (3 pages, typewritten; B-3) Directive 23/BT, dated 5 Apr 70 prepared for the signature of Le Mac Thanh, Current Affairs Committee, Binh Tan ((possibly aka Binh Tuy Province Party Committee, VC Region 6)), addressed to subordinate agencies, provides an assessment on the Cambodian coup d'etat and outlines missions to be carried out in order to cope with the new development of the situation in Cambodia; in accordance with Directive 06 of R ((possibly BOSVN)).

Document states that the US-instigated coup d'etat in Cambodia was aimed at helping the Americans implement their Vietnamization program.

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and recover from their defeats in SVN. However, the expansion of war to Cambodia drove the SVN, Cambodian, and Lao revolutionary forces closer together to defeat the Americans and their satellites. Although the Cambodian coup d'etat had caused some difficulties for friendly ((VC/NVA)) forces, it could not reverse the US disadvantage in SVN.

Regarding missions to be carried out in the immediate future, document directs Party members, troops, and the people to (1) conduct repeated military attacks; (2) support the Cambodian and Lao revolutionary movements; (3) lead Vietnamese people living in Cambodia to conduct political struggles opposing the oppression and terrorist activities of the reactionaries; (4) motivate the Cambodian people and local authorities to respond to the appeals of Sihanouk; (5) emphasize the protection of friendly ((VC/NVA)) depots and the capturing of enemy weapons and ammunition; (5) increase tax collection and farm production; and (6) practice thrift to insure sufficient provisions and ammunition for troops and cadre.

Copies of this directive were sent to the Finance-Economy Section; Military Affairs Committee; Medical Section; and Đat of Unit Quyet Thang ((possibly 33rd NVA Regiment, operating in VC Military Region 6)).
