* GEN. HAIG REPORTS TO NIXON ON VN FACT-FINDING MISSION

San Clemente, California, July 5 (CNA-AP): President Nixon received a personal report Wednesday from a White House aide just back from a Vietnam fact-finding mission.

Maj. Gen. Alexander M. Haig, deputy assistant to the President for national security affairs, had returned Tuesday from a five-day trip to Vietnam and Cambodia. He conferred with Nixon and Henry Kissinger, the President's top foreign affairs adviser, at the ocean front Western White House.

Details of Haig's report were not disclosed, but indications are that it would include the White House aide's assessment of the effectiveness of the mining of North Vietnamese harbors and stepped-up U.S. bombing raids on the North. Radio Hanoi said Wednesday that the North Vietnamese were getting war supplies by sea through 12 coastal points. White House Press Secretary Ronald L. Ziegler said, "We have no evidence to support that claim."
