NCNA: AMERICANS PROTEST CONTINUED AID TO THIEU

[Text] Peking, January 30, 1975 (HSINHUA)--The American people have taken action in the past few days to protest against the U.S. Government's continued aid to the Nguyen Van Thieu puppet regime, according to Washington reports.

About 400 ex-servicemen and other people held a rally in San Francisco at noon on January 27, to denounce aid to the Saigon regime by the U.S. Government. Holding high the flag of the Republic of South Vietnam, they held a demonstration, picketed the Saigon regime's consulate, and occupied its office for a short time.

A number of U.S. Federal Government departments received warning yesterday that bombs will be used to oppose the U.S. Government's support for Nguyen Van Thieu puppet regime. A pre-dawn explosion took place at the State Department building that day.

The U.S. Government requested Congress on January 28 to approve a supplemental appropriation of \$300 million for military assistance to the Saigon puppet regime and an additional \$222 million for military aid to the traitorous Lon Nol clique.
