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PRGRSV DELEGATION CONDEMNS DISPATCH OF USAF PERSONNEL TO RVN

[Text] According to a Paris-based LPA correspondent, the spokesman for the PRGRSV delegation to the La Celle-Saint-Cloud consultative conference issued a statement on 6 February vehemently denouncing the Americans for sending U.S. Air Force personnel to Saigon to directly help Thieu conduct the war.

The statement points out that since the signing of the Paris agreement, the Americans have constantly intensified their military involvement and interference in South Vietnam, provided the Nguyen Van Thieu clique with billions of dollars annually, and maintained in South Vietnam 25,000 military personnel disguised as civilians. Recently, they sent U.S. warships to operate illegally off the South Vietnamese coast and have had U.S. aircraft guide Saigon troops in conducting their acts of war.

It affirms that in such a situation, the dispatch of U.S. Air Force personnel to Saigon is obviously a serious escalation in intensifying the U.S. military involvement and interference in South Vietnam and a gross violation of the Paris agreement.

It stresses that in addition to loudly distorting facts and falsely accusing North Vietnam of invading South Vietnam in an attempt to pressure the U.S. Congress into providing an additional \$300 million in military aid to Thieu for the current fiscal year and \$1.3 billion in fiscal year 1976, the Americans are brazenly escalating their military involvement in South Vietnam, thus creating an extremely serious situation in the area.

It points out that no matter how the Ford administration distorts facts and utter slanders, it will not be able to conceal the truth that the Americans and their lackeys are feverishly stepping up the war, repression and terrorism.

The statement says in conclusion: The PRGRSV delegation to the La Celle-Saint-Cloud consultative conference vehemently denounces the escalation of U.S. military involvement in South Vietnam and resolutely rejects the deceitful allegations by the Ford administration in asking for more money to support the war in South Vietnam and Cambodia.

Obviously, the responsibility for the increasingly grave situation in South Vietnam at the present time falls entirely on the Americans and their lackeys. The Americans must completely end their U.S. military involvement and interference in South Vietnam's internal affairs, as prescribed in the Paris agreement, in order to restore peace and achieve national concord in South Vietnam.
