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NHAN DAN COMMENTATOR BLASTS U.S. EVACUATION OF VIETNAMESE

[Text] While the U.S.-Thieu clique was feverishly implementing a policy aimed at carrying out forcible evacuation in the southern part of our country, on 4 April a Washington-based REUTER correspondent reported:

Officials here have stated that the U.S. Government is calmly and urgently studying a plan to move 1 million Vietnamese from South Vietnam to foreign countries. At the request of the U.S. secretary of state, these refugees will be allowed to enter the United States without going through the routine procedures followed by immigrants.

The report also disclosed that Republican Senator Helms of North Carolina had sent a message to President Ford requesting the deployment of the entire U.S. 7th Fleet to move 2 million or more South Vietnamese to foreign countries within 7 days. The report was dispatched the same day U.S. President Ford held a press conference dealing to a great extent with the so-called "problem concerning refugees" and made it known that he had ordered the cancellation of bureaucratic procedures and other complicated paperwork related to the entrance of Vietnamese into the United States.

The U.S. imperialists have exposed more and more clearly their pernicious schemes. Over the past several weeks, faced with the repeated victories of the South Vietnamese armed forces and people in their offensive and uprisings aimed at punishing the Nguyen Van Thieu clique for committing crimes against our people and for sabotaging the Paris agreement, the fleeing puppet administrative and military personnel have forced our compatriots to follow them. While the Vietnamese people and broad sections of world public opinion are vehemently denouncing this cruel scheme, Washington has been feverishly helping the Thieu clique to carry out forcible evacuation while at the same time urging the United Nations and other countries to take part in a "humanitarian mission."

The Ford administration, brazenly violating the Paris agreement, intervening in the internal affairs of South Vietnam and acting contrary to U.S. law prohibiting the dispatch of armed forces to foreign countries, has had U.S. warships and Marines force a number of our compatriots to evacuate.

The second task Washington has tried to carry out in the past several days within the framework of the abovementioned dark scheme is the sending of several thousand children from South Vietnam to the United States. Yesterday, 4 April, more than 100 children lost their lives when a C-5A aircraft of the U.S. Air Force crashed and burned while attempting to take them to the United States. This tragic incident has increased the U.S. imperialists' crimes against our people.

The U.S.-Thieu clique's plot to force the people to evacuate, as well as its ballyhoo about this matter, has not brought the expected results. The great majority of our compatriots in the Central Highlands, in Hue and Danang, and in other provinces have been determined to remain their native places. They have refused to be forced by the enemy to go with it or have sought ways to return while en route to new places. This is a heavy political setback for the U.S.-Thieu clique.

World public opinion has not been deceived by the U.S.-Thieu clique's plot. It knows people have gone with the puppet troops because they are afraid the Thieu clique will have planes bomb the liberated areas, as it has done in the past, and not because they are afraid of communism.

Public opinion also denounces the U.S.-Thieu clique's plot to force the people to go away in order to conscript youths into the army to prolong the war. Many Western news agencies have pointed out that the percentage of people remaining in the newly liberated cities is high.

The United States has also used warships and aircraft to help Thieu carry out forcible evacuation of the population, and the United States set up an airlift with the largest U.S. military cargo planes urgently bringing in heavy weapons for the Saigon army. At the same time, the United States is helping Thieu sell Vietnamese children to capitalist countries--2,000 of them have been sold to the United States. Furthermore, it has placed U.S. Marine units in Okinawa on alert and, more blatantly still, has sent warships and Marines to Vietnam's waters in an attempt to intimidate our people. This is the true nature of the so-called plan to protect and evacuate U.S. nationals in South Vietnam. In addition, the United States has brought pressure to bear on some governments and has urged them to participate in the U.S. scheme of forcible evacuation.

By carrying out the aforementioned cynical acts, the Ford administration wants to prop up the morale of the collapsing puppet army and puppet administration and help the Nguyen Van Thieu junta grossly trample upon the South Vietnamese people's democratic liberties and right to self-determination, drag on the war and pile up more crimes against the South Vietnamese people.

But can these acts by the United States reverse the current situation in South Vietnam? Can they prevent the ship of the Thieu regime from its imminent sinking? This is a basic and pressing problem over which the Ford administration should ponder if it does not want to bog down once again in the Vietnam quagmire. In the past few days, many influential figures in U.S. political circles have bluntly said that it is now too late for the United States to reverse the situation in South Vietnam, that the situation is irreversible, and so forth.

As the 3 April statement by the DRV Foreign Ministry clearly pointed out, the situation in South Vietnam shows that the collapse of the Nguyen Van Thieu junta is unavoidable. Therefore, all tricks of the Ford administration to prolong its agony are futile. The stubborn pursuance of an outdated warlike policy will only lead the Ford administration to ever more serious consequences in all fields.

#### RADIO NOTES WALDHEIM REFUSAL OF U.S. REQUEST ON EVACUATION

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[Text] The Ford administration and Nguyen Van Thieu have repeatedly urged UN Secretary General Waldheim to request UN participation in the so-called efforts to evacuate refugees in the RVN. This is a perfidious plot of the U.S.-Thieu clique to inveigle the UN Organization into the crime of forcing the South Vietnamese people to evacuate.

According to U.S. sources, including the VOA, Mr Waldheim on 2 April turned down the U.S.-Thieu clique's request and decided not to allow the United Nations to participate in the evacuation activities.

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Many public organizations and newspapers in many countries have exposed and denounced the U.S.-Thieu clique's slanderous arguments. UN Secretary General Waldheim has turned down the U.S. Government's request for UN participation in efforts to evacuate refugees. It is regrettable that a small number of governments have sympathized with and helped the United States in its criminal acts.

Along with the crimes of forcing the people to evacuate and taking children away, there is a plan to evacuate millions of Vietnamese people to the United States. This plan, which is another extremely shrewd and cunning scheme of the U.S. imperialists and the Nguyen Van Thieu clique, is aimed at serving many sinister purposes. As an immediate goal, they will rely on this plan to continue to claim that many Vietnamese people are anticommunist, and the United States will have a pretext to prolong its involvement in our country. The imperialists' plan to use force to take many people away is also designed to implement their future sinister schemes. It is part of the foreign policy of U.S. imperialism.

Our people are determined to condemn and denounce this shrewd and malicious plot of the U.S.-Thieu clique in its policy of forcing our people to leave their native places to live in the areas still under its temporary control, in sending Vietnamese children to the United States, and in the plan to evacuate millions of our compatriots to serve as a tool of the U.S. imperialists and capitalists.

These are very serious crimes against the Vietnamese people. They are contrary to the South Vietnamese people's right to self-determination, to the Paris agreement to which the United States is signatory, and to the desire of the U.S. people and Congress for the United States to end its involvement in Vietnam.
