

FRONT RADIO DERIDES KISSINGER ARGUMENTS ON EVACUATING VIETNAMESE

Liberation Radio [Clandestine] in Vietnamese to South Vietnam 0500 GMT 18 Apr 75 SG

[Text] According to Western sources, in a speech delivered on 17 April before the American Society of Newspaper Editors in Washington, U.S. Secretary of State Kissinger again brazenly lied when he tried to blame the DRV Government for frantically violating the Paris agreement. He also advanced extremely deceitful arguments, claiming that the United States has the moral responsibility to evacuate from South Vietnam those Vietnamese whose lives may be imperiled by a communist takeover there.

This is obviously an utterly shameless argument. It should be pointed out that it was Kissinger who initialed the Paris agreement. However, immediately afterwards, he reneged on his signature and has persisted in illegally pouring weapons and war materiel into South Vietnam for the Thieu clique to gravely sabotage the Paris agreement and to conduct the criminal neocolonialist war.

On several occasions Kissinger has reiterated the so-called U.S. moral responsibility toward the Thieu clique. What responsibility permits the United States to use aircraft and warships to force our compatriots to evacuate with the U.S.-Thieu clique? What responsibility permits the United States to kidnap and evacuate hundreds of children to the United States and other countries, causing the senseless deaths of many of them? The so-called moral commitment as well as the moral responsibility that Kissinger and the Ford administration have repeatedly spoken of is completely illegal and inconsistent with the U.S. legal commitments in the Paris agreement.

Kissinger, as well as the U.S. administration, has tried to capitalize on the deceitful argument about saving the lives of the South Vietnamese people in an attempt to stir up the American people and Congress so as to get more dollars for the Thieu clique. Nevertheless, this trick can deceive no one; and no one believes that there will be a massacre in the newly liberated areas, a massacre that the U.S. administration has made a fuss about.

U.S. Defense Department spokesman (Sadel) himself has had to acknowledge that the Defense Department has not yet obtained any proof of massacres being committed in the conquered territory--meaning the newly liberated areas in South Vietnam.

The 25 March 1975 PRGRSV seven-point policy and its 1 April 1975 10-point policy are aimed at eliminating hatred and suspicion and at achieving great unity and national concord. These policies have been and are being implemented in the newly liberated areas, where large numbers of the people of various strata clearly realize that none of the compatriots who have a national spirit are silly enough to evacuate with the Americans, leave their native land and lead a life that is dependent on foreigners.

The U.S. plans to evacuate Vietnamese constitute a criminal action. Its forcible evacuation of the people is a brazen act of intervention that grossly encroaches on the South Vietnamese people's right to self-determination and completely violates the Paris agreement as well as international law.

The South Vietnamese people resolutely reject the deceitful, distorted arguments advanced by Kissinger and the U.S. administration. It should be pointed out that no U.S. maneuvers or efforts can salvage the country-selling Nguyen Van Thieu lackey clique from drowning.

FORD'S ORDER TO EVACUATE NONESSENTIAL AMERICANS REPORTED

[Text] South Vietnam April 19 LPA--Sources from Saigon said that on April 16, 1975 U.S. President G. Ford officially ordered to evacuate all the Americans who do not hold an important duty in Saigon.

The U.S. Embassy in Saigon has begun evacuating American personnel and families within only 24 hrs. These people are members of the U.S. Embassy, the Defense Attaches's Organization (DAO), and other Americans who work on contract for the DAO.

It is known that in the past few days, that is before Ford's official order of evacuation of Americans from Saigon, many members of the U.S. Embassy and a number of representatives of U.S. firms and enterprises left Saigon for home.

[Text] According to AFP, Richard Moose and Charles Meissner, two staff members of the U.S. Senate Foreign Relations Committee, after their return from a 12-day visit to South Vietnam, submitted a secret report to the committee affirming that the military situation of the Thieu administration is desperate and the southern PLAF will be able to win in the coming days.
