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VNA REPORTS LIFE RETURNING TO NORMAL IN LIBERATED AREAS

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[Text] Hanoi VNA April 18--With the help of the revolutionary administration all cinemas in Danang, including the Kim Chau, Lido Kim, Kinh Do and Tan Thanh cinemas, have resumed their four daily screenings.

Film shows have also been projected regularly at public places. Some films on show were presented by North Vietnam to the people in the liberated areas such as the "Historic May Day", celebrating the Vietnamese great victory over the U.S. aggression following the signing of the 1973 Paris agreement; "Farewell to Uninvited Guests", on the release of U.S. pilots captured in North Vietnam; and "Nguyen Thai Binh", dealing with the activities of a patriotic South Vietnamese student murdered by CIA agents on his flight home from the United States. In the 2 weeks following liberation, cinema audiences in Danang totalled nearly two million.

Almost 500 teachers at primary and secondary schools in Quang Ngai provincial capital have returned to their schools. They have met the People's Revolutionary Committee and the educational service of Quang Ngai to discuss preparations for the new school-year in the liberated city. More than 2,500 text books for various levels of general education have been distributed to schools in the city.

Life in Qui Nhon city (Binh Dinh Province) has completely returned to normal. Hospitals have reopened, and water and electricity are in adequate supply. The revolutionary administration on April 5 inaugurated the first passenger train between Qui Nhon and Phu My. Fishing boats are again putting to sea. Thousands of people gathered at the city hall to attend the first film show presented on April 5 by the Binh Dinh liberation film projection team.
