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FRONT RADIO NOTES CAN CABINET RESIGNATION. EMBASSY CLOSINGS

[Text] According to Saigon reports, on 24 April Tran Van Huong had to dissolve the 10-day-old Nguyen Ba Can cabinet in the hope of appeasing public opinion, which is demanding that Huong and those closely associated with Thieu resign.

On the afternoon of 24 April, a delegation of the National Reconciliation Force called on and handed over to Huong a motion demanding that he resign. The motion pointed out: A Thieu government without Thieu will not be able to settle anything.

According to Western sources, in recent days Saigon has been living in a complete vacuum. AFP has reported that people are engaged all day long in trading rumors and the most fantastic reports, such as a report saying that the puppet government stands ready to surrender. The BBC has reported that Saigon would fall in a matter of days of in a few weeks at the very best.

AFP reported on 24 April: Five West European embassies--the British, West German, Netherlands, Italian and Belgian--have reduced their staff and are preparing to close. The Thai Embassy withdrew all of its remaining staff on 24 April. The Canadian acting foreign minister said on 24 April that all members of the staff of the Canadian Embassy in Saigon had been withdrawn.
