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COL VO DONG GIANG HOLDS PRESS MEETING AT TAN SON NHUT 26 APR

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[Text] South Vietnam April 29 LPA--At a press conference held in the Tan Son Nhut airfield on April 26, 1975, Colonel Vo Dong Giang, deputy-head of the military delegation of the

Provisional Revolutionary Government of the Republic of South Vietnam to the central Two-Party Joint Military Commission, denounced the Ford administration for continuing its policy of military involvement and interference in the internal affairs of South Vietnam while ballyhooing about the ending of the U.S. role in South Vietnam.

Colonel Vo Dong Giang pointed out: "After having ousted Nguyen Van Thieu, President Ford tried to make believe that he is changing his policy.
