TO BURN VILLAGES," "DROP RUCK AND McNAMARA, NOT RPT NOT THE BOMB,"
"MANY CRIST" SCHEME!"

A NEGRO WOMAN WAS CHEERED AS SHE STOOD ON THE STEPS OF
THE PETAGON AND DENOUNCED THE VIETNAM CONFLICT AS "WHITE
CHAUVINIST" WAR.
