Army Spec. 4 C. Dennis S. Pelliccia has been awarded the first oak leaf cluster with "V" (for Victory) device to the Air Medal for heroism while engaged in aerial flights in South Vietnam.

Assigned to the Aviation Section of Headquarters, 1st Region, Army Air Defense Command at Stewart Air Force Base Pelliccia was presented the award by Maj. Gen. Melville B. Coburn, commanding general of the region.

The 24-year-old soldier distinguished himself May 12, 1968 by exceptionally valorous actions while participating in the emergency resupply of ammunition and final evacuation of American and Allied Forces from the Special Forces Camp at Kham Duc, South Vietnam, which was under enemy attack.
