

ADMINISTRATIVE INSTRUCTIONS

The following instructions are furnished to provide you with guidance in complying with your active duty orders.

1. Orders:

a. Copies of orders: Insure that you have copies of your active duty orders, and any amendments issued, if applicable, readily available upon arrival at your first duty station.

b. First Duty Station: Your first duty station is the station at which you will perform temporary duty (officer basic course). If there is no temporary duty indicated on your orders, the first duty station is the station of ASSIGNMENT. Your orders will indicate initial assignment (Asg to Act Dy Acces Det:) to the Active Duty Accession Detachment, Headquarters, Third US Army, Fort McPherson, Georgia 30330. This assignment is for the purpose of strength accountability only; travel to this station is not authorized. Do not, repeat not, report to the Active Duty Accession Detachment, Headquarters, Third US Army.

c. Reporting Date: This is the date on which you are required to report to your first duty station and you should commence your travel so as to report between 0800 and 1700 hours on the date indicated (individuals reporting to Fort Belvoir, Virginia will report between 0800 and 1200 hours, if possible). If, because of unforeseen circumstances, you are unable to arrive on this date, you should immediately contact the Commander of the station to which you are to report.

d. Abbreviations Used in Orders: Inclosure 1 to these administrative instructions explains in full the meaning of all abbreviations contained in your active duty orders.

e. Effective Date of Active Duty: Your effective date of active duty will be computed after your arrival at your first duty station on the basis of travel time authorized and your scheduled reporting date. You are cautioned on premature departure in complying with these orders to insure that you are fully protected in the event of accidents enroute to your duty station, as your pay and allowances begin on the effective date of active duty.

2. Travel and Transportation:

a. Travel Time: You are authorized to perform travel by public conveyance (TPA), in which you are allowed to select your mode of travel. If you travel by privately owned vehicle (POV), your travel time is based on distances established by the Standard Highway Guide and you are allowed one day for each 300 miles and one day also for a fraction of 300 miles in excess of 150 miles. If you select travel by common carrier (rail, bus, or air) your travel time is based upon schedules of the mode of public transportation actually used. Delay enroute is not authorized.

b. Travel Expense:

(1) Travel at Personal Expense with subsequent Government Reimbursement: You may travel to your first duty station at your own expense and upon arrival, during your personnel records processing, you will be reimbursed at the rate of 6 cents per mile for the official distance.

(2) Travel at Government Expense: If you elect to travel to your first duty station at government expense, you must obtain a Transportation Request (TR) from the transportation officer of any Army installation or activity. You may do this by presenting him with a copy of your active duty orders. If this is not practicable, written application may be made, addressed to the Commanding Officer of the nearest Army installation or activity, ATTN: TRANSPORTATION OFFICER, inclosing a copy of your active duty orders. Upon receipt of the Transportation Request you may exchange it for a ticket from the ticket agent for the selected mode of transportation. In this respect, prompt action should be taken so that tickets can be obtained, travel reservations made and you can commence travel on the date required to insure that you report on the date indicated in your orders.

c. Shipment and/or Storage of Household Goods and Personal Effects: You are authorized shipment of 600 pounds of personal effects to your temporary duty station. Although you are authorized shipment of household goods to your station of assignment, such shipment should be delayed until completion of your temporary duty assignment. In this connection, you are authorized temporary storage of your permanent change of station weight allowance for the period of temporary duty and the period of departure under permanent change of station orders. If your temporary duty station and station of assignment are the same, you are entitled to shipment of your permanent change of station weight allowance upon entry on active duty. However, in order to receive the best possible service in movement and/or storage of household goods and personal effects and to protect your interest as well as that of the government, you should make personal or written contact with the transportation officer of the nearest Army installation or activity who will simplify your move.

d. Dependent Travel:

(1) Assignment within Continental United States: You are not authorized travel of your dependents to your temporary duty station. However, they are authorized travel to your station of assignment and you will be reimbursed for their travel upon completion of such travel and arrival at your station of assignment.

(2) Assignment Overseas: Dependents are not authorized to accompany or join you at your overseas command at government expense unless you are assigned to a long tour overseas area and can complete the normal overseas tour with dependents. The length of the overseas tour depends upon area or country of assignment, but is usually a 36 month tour. To satisfy this requirement it is necessary for you to request an extension of your active duty commitment from Department of the Army. Application and assistance in this matter and processing of your concurrent travel request must be accomplished at your TDY installation.

3. Home Address and Current Location (PL EAD/OAD):

a. Reimbursement: Reimbursement for travel to your first duty station will be made from the address contained after "Curr Loc:" (Current Location) or "PL EAD/OAD:" (Place Entered Active Duty/Ordered Active Duty) line of your active duty orders. If current location address is same as home of record address, orders will indicate "NA" (NOT APPLICABLE) after current location or place entered active duty and reimbursement for travel will be authorized from home of record address. If your Home of Record (HOR) or Current Location is different from that indicated in your active duty orders, you must notify this headquarters, ATTN: AJAGR-A, at once so that proper amendments may be issued.

b. Travel from Outside the Continental United States: If your Home of Record or Current Location shown in attached orders is located outside the Continental United States, government transportation to the Zone of Interior is available to you and must be utilized. If you elect to travel by commercial carrier you will not be reimbursed for such travel. Arrangements can be made for your return by government transportation by reporting to the nearest military installation in the oversea area, presenting copies of your active duty orders and requesting they arrange transportation which will allow you to report to your first duty station in compliance with scheduled reporting date. If you are being ordered to active duty from an address in Puerto Rico, upon receipt of orders, you should report to Transportation Office, located in Building #271, Fort Buchanan, Puerto Rico, in order to make necessary arrangements to proceed to your temporary duty station in The Continental United States.

4. Physical Status: If at any time prior to your entry on active duty you have reason to believe that there has been a significant change in your medical condition since your last medical examination you should advise this headquarters, ATTN: AJAGR-A.

5. Uniforms:

a. Reporting for Duty:

(1) In Uniform: It is desired that you report for active duty in the proper uniform, if possible; however, this is not mandatory. Keep in mind that seasonal changes for uniform wear normally occur in April for change from winter to summer uniform, and in October for change from summer to winter uniform. The specific dates for changeover vary at each service school due to climatic conditions, so you will have to write to the commandant of the school for exact changeover dates if you are being ordered to active duty during April or October.

(2) In Civilian Attire: It is recognized that the majority of ROTC graduates entering active duty will not have a complete issue of military uniforms in their possession. The general consensus of the branch service schools is that the officer not purchase any items of uniform wear not presently owned at the time of receipt of active duty orders. Adequate opportunity is made available in the processing schedule at the service school for officers to purchase uniforms from either the Army Clothing Sales Store or Post Exchange. However, you should bring presently owned items of military uniform with you when reporting for duty. If you do not have a complete uniform, you should report for active duty in appropriate civilian attire, to include coat and tie.

b. Uniform Allowance: You can expect to receive your initial and active duty uniform allowance approximately 14 days after your arrival at your first duty station. Since you will be required to purchase your active duty uniforms shortly after your arrival, you should arrive with sufficient funds to defray these initial expenses. As your initial and active duty uniform allowance totals \$300.00 (\$200.00 for initial and \$100.00 for active duty) you can normally expect to spend that amount in purchase of uniforms and accouterments.

c. Purchasing Uniforms: If you desire to purchase uniforms prior to entering active duty, a copy of your active duty orders will gain you admittance to any Army Clothing Sales Store or Post Exchange. You are cautioned against purchasing items of military uniform from other than the Army Clothing Sales Store or Post Exchange. Other agencies or commercial companies might sell inferior products which do not meet strict Governmental specification standards.

6. Personal Affairs: In order that expeditious action can be taken in issuance of DD Form 1173 (Uniform Services Identification and Privilege Card) and to insure proper support of financial record entries you are requested to have a copy of your marriage certificate, if married, in your possession upon reporting for active duty.

7. Summary: It is recognized that the above information will not answer all of your questions, but it is hoped that it does clarify the main problem area. Any further questions that you have can be answered by written correspondence with this headquarters, ATTN: AJAGR-A, or telephone Area Code 404 752-2312, 752-3254. Any telephone calls will have to be made at your own expense as this office is not authorized to accept collect calls.

EXPLANATION OF ABBREVIATIONS AND TERMINOLOGY
ACTIVE DUTY ORDERS

1. Basically the information following the Transaction Code (TC) orders you to active duty for the period indicated after your active duty commitment (ADC). You are to proceed from your current location to your first duty station in sufficient time to arrive on the reporting date indicated, traveling by whatever mode of travel you select.

2. Lead lines following the transaction code information are explained as follows:

First line includes your basic personnel data, ie., name, social security account number, grade, military occupational specialty (MOS), present unit of assignment (Third USA Control Group (Officer Active Duty Obligor) Fort McPherson Georgia 30330), basic branch and detail branch, if appropriate. If you have not yet been commissioned when your active duty orders are issued, this line will include only your name, social security account number, grade, MOS, and school from which commissioned.

ADMINISTRATIVE ACCOUNTING DATA

Authority:

The authority by which you are ordered to two years active duty; three years active duty if you participated in ROTC Flight Training; or four years active duty if you are an ROTC Scholarship recipient.

Allocation:

A Department of the Army code used in relation to personnel requisitioning.

Home of Record:

Place recorded as your official home of record.

Place Entered Active Duty/
Ordered to Active Duty or
Current Location:

Place from which ordered to active duty. If listed as "NA" (NOT APPLICABLE) then the address following Home of Record is the place from which travel commences.

Procurement Program Number:

Code used by Department of the Army in relation to the procurement program from which you were commissioned or appointed.

Component:

United States Army Reserve (This lead line will only be indicated on orders issued for officers. If you have not been appointed when your orders are issued this line will not be shown.)

Sex:

Male

Accounting Classification:

Citations for funding of uniform allowance.

Permanent Change of Station
Movement Designator Code:

An Accounting code used by Department of the Army in funding procedures.

Assign to Active Duty
Accession Detachment:

Active Duty Accession Detachment, Headquarters Third US Army, Fort McPherson, Georgia 30330. This assignment is for the purpose of strength accountability only; travel to this station is not authorized. Do not, repeat not, report to the Active Duty Accession Detachment, Headquarters, Third US Army.

Effective date (Active
Duty Accession Detachment):

Used by gaining and losing organizations for unit morning report purposes.

FOR THE INDIVIDUAL

Effective date of active duty:

To be determined at first duty station. Your official date of entry on active duty will be determined at your first duty station based on travel time; etc.

Active duty commitment:

OBV 2 years: Obligated volunteer officer with a two year active duty commitment. OBV 3 years: Obligated volunteer officer with a three year active duty commitment after completion or termination of initial Army Flight Training instruction as a result of participation in ROTC Flight Instruction. OBV 4 years: Obligated volunteer officer with a four year active duty commitment as a result of participation in the ROTC Scholarship program.

Control branch:

This lead line is indicated only on orders for those individuals who have not been appointed at time orders are issued. This line will show your detail branch if you are a Regular Army selectee, detailed to a combat arms; otherwise, this line is "NOT APPLICABLE".

Temporary duty en route at:

Initial station to which you will report for temporary duty prior to reporting to your assigned station.

Reporting date (TDY station):

This is the reporting date on which you are to report to your temporary duty station, arriving between the hours 0800 - 1700, if possible. Between 0800 - 1200 hours for individuals reporting to Fort Belvoir, Virginia.

Period of temporary duty:

This is the approximate period of your length of stay at your temporary duty station.

Purpose of temporary duty:

This is the branch basic course, course and class number, of the school you will attend.

Assigned to:

The permanent station or overseas area to which you will report after completion of your temporary duty assignment.

Reporting date:

This is the reporting date to your station of reassignment. Normally listed as NA, "NOT APPLICABLE", unless a specific date is indicated.

Leave data:

Indicates total number of days leave authorized following completion of temporary duty. (DDALV-Days delay enroute chargeable as leave.)

Availability date:

Date you are available for port call if assigned to an overseas area. If your station of assignment is within CONUS, this line will indicate NA, "NOT APPLICABLE".

Port call data:

NA, "NOT APPLICABLE". If you are assigned to an overseas area, actual port call instructions will be furnished you prior to your departure from your temporary duty station.

Special Instructions:

- (a) Comply with the following numbered items of DA Supplemental Instructions: (Numbers indicated correspond to Department of the Army Supplemental Instructions Sheet which is inclosed.)
- (b) Comply with the following numbered items of Hq Third US Army Supplemental Instructions: (Not applicable to orders issued for ROTC graduates.)
- (c) Special instructions to direct accomplishment of specific actions necessary in compliance with entry on active duty not contained elsewhere.

DISTRIBUTION indicates distribution of active duty orders made by this headquarters at time of issuance.

DEPARTMENT OF THE ARMY
SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTIONS TO ORDERS
(These instructions are an integral part of the basic order.)

1. Pursuant to a DOD directive individual is not authorized to enter into a rental or lease agreement for an apartment or trailer court facility without first consulting the housing officer servicing the installation or agency to which assigned. Individual will contact or communicate with either personally or thru an agent the housing referral officer of such individual designated by the commander of the installation or agency to which assigned who will provide current information concerning apartment or trailer court facilities which individual may not lease or rent because of unfavorable racial segregation practices. (Msg DA 889409)
2. Travel by rail, bus, ship or privately owned vehicle is authorized. (JTR)
3. Travel by privately owned vehicle authorized provided it does not interfere with reporting date. (JTR)
4. Travel by privately owned vehicle is authorized as more advantageous to the Government. (JTR)
5. Travel by public carrier only is directed. (JTR)
9. Use of hired conveyance, to include air taxi, is authorized in the vicinity where TDY is to be performed. (JTR)
12. Travel within and around TDY station authorized.
13. Authority is granted to make such changes in above itinerary and to proceed to such additional places as may be necessary for accomplishment of this mission.
14. Individual will report to local transportation officer upon receipt of orders for transportation to port and for issuance of DD Form 1482 (MAC Transportation Authority).
15. Use of transportation request and meal tickets directed. (JTR)
16. Transportation Request and meal tickets (as appropriate) will be furnished, upon request to the nearest Military Transportation Officer. (JTR)
19. Travel will be at no expense to the Government. (JTR)
20. Individual must have funds to pay cost of commercial round trip travel and must arrange transportation to return to parent unit by end of leave. Extension of leave based on lack of space available transportation will not be approved. (AR 55-28, AR 630-5)
21. Government quarters and mess will be used when available.
23. Enlisted member in receipt of separate rations should not pay for meals obtained in Government messing facility while in TDY status. Separate rations will be withdrawn during period of TDY. Authority to mess separately at TDY point is dependent on orders issued by commander at TDY point. (DODPM)
24. Utilization of existing Government facility would adversely affect the performance of the assigned mission. (JTR)
25. Concurrent travel of dependents authorized. (AR 55-46)
26. Concurrent travel of dependents not authorized. (AR 55-46)
27. Overseas travel of dependents is not authorized during this tour. (AR 55-46, AR 614-30)
28. Family separation allowance, shipment of household goods, and movement of dependents to a designated location is authorized. (JTR)
29. Movement of dependents and household goods to temporary duty station is not authorized at Government expense, except as prescribed in Part D, Chapter 8, Joint Travel Regulations. (AR 55-71)
30. Individual is advised that taking his dependents, privately owned vehicle and/or household goods to his training activity could cause him embarrassment, work a severe hardship on his dependents and interfere with his training assignment.
31. Shipment of hold baggage by air freight authorized. (JTR)
32. Shipment of household goods authorized. DA Pamphlet 55-2 applies. (AR 55-71)
33. Shipment of privately owned vehicle authorized. (AR 55-71).
34. Movement of dependents and household goods at Government expense not authorized. (AR 55-71)
35. Air baggage allowance: 66 lbs. (AR 55-71)
36. Air baggage allowance: 66 lbs plus 134 lbs excess. (AR 55-71)
39. Individual will insert a copy of his orders on the top inside of each piece of hand carried baggage and baggage to be checked.
40. Individual will determine clothing requirements for travel and new assignment prior to departure from losing organization. (AR 670-6, AR 700-84)
41. Individual may wear civilian clothing while in travel status. (AR 59-12)
42. Appropriate civilian clothing will be worn. (AR 670-6)
43. Civilian clothing is desirable for off-duty hours. (AR 670-6)
44. Individual will not depart home station until port call instructions are received.
45. If no port call is received ten days prior to availability date, contact nearest Army installation, referring to Port Call Control Number and request assistance and instructions. If no port call is received by the reporting date, send collect TWX to US Army Overseas Replacement Station to which assigned requesting assistance and instructions.
46. Port call will be obtained by CO of TDY station (AR 55-28)
50. Individual may report earlier than date specified and leave charged will be reduced accordingly.
51. Individual will report between 0800-1700 hours on scheduled reporting date.
53. EM traveling under permissive reassignment at no expense to the Government. Travel time will be charged to accrued leave. (JTR)
54. Any time between availability date and port call date is chargeable as leave. (AR 55-28)
58. Firearms, ammunition, or any kind of explosive or incendiary device is prohibited in personal baggage on military aircraft. (AR 55-355)
59. The introduction, purchase and possession of privately owned weapons is prohibited in RVN. (AR 55-71)
60. NATO travel order required. (AR 310-10)
61. Passports and/or visas required. (Comply with AR 600-290)
62. Individual will insure immunizations are current prior to departure. (AR 40-562)
63. Medical examination for individual and dependents and correction of medical and dental defects to meet fitness standards prescribed in AR 40-501 will be accomplished prior to departure from home station.
64. Individual desiring partial, advance or advance travel pay will apply to his unit commander immediately.

66. Individual will carry all personnel records to TDY station. (AR 640-10)

67. Individual is a 2d RVN Tour Volunteer for specific organization. (AR 614-30)

70. All commands through which this shipment passes will process individual(s) as attached.

71. Individual required to participate regularly and frequently in aerial flight as a crewmember. (AR 600-106)

72. Individual required to participate regularly and frequently in aerial flight as a noncrewmember. (AR 600-106)

73. Current flying status continues in effect. (AR 600-106)

74. Individual authorized to continue wearing Army aviator badge. (AR 600-106)

75. These orders remain in effect after discharge and reenlistment without break in service unless sooner terminated. (AR 600-106)

76. If not sooner terminated, these orders are invalid 30 days after recall to active duty, upon reassignment to an inactive status within the Reserve Component, or separation from the Reserve Component. (AR 600-106)

77. Board will be convened at the direction of the President and proceedings conducted in accordance with applicable provisions of appropriate Army Regulation. The senior member present will be shown on board proceedings as President and the junior member will be shown as recorder without vote.

78. On the date oath of office is executed, you will telegraphically inform this HQ, ATTN: AJAAG-R, as follows: "I executed oath of office for Regular Army appointment on (date) in compliance with your orders number () dated (). Signed: (name, social security account number, grade)."

79. Effective on entry on active duty, officer is appointed in the AUS grade equal to his USAR grade and such AUS appointment is considered to have been accepted effective the date of entry on active duty.

80. Additional pay authorized by Public Law 497 to Medical and Dental Corps Officers entering initially on active duty must be substantiated at first duty station by three copies of a document attesting to the dates of attendance at medical school or dental school. In addition, medical officers must have three copies of a certificate indicating completion of internship. Diplomas, transcripts, certificates or letters from the institution involved will suffice if entrance and completed dates are shown. Documents will not be returned.

81. Initial assignment to the ACTIVE DUTY ACCESSION DETACHMENT is for the purpose of strength accountability only. Travel of individual, dependents and shipment of household goods to the Active Duty Accession Detachment are not authorized. (DA Msg 20521, para 4)

82. If individual fails to report for active duty/active duty for training as directed, he becomes liable to disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice. (Title 10 USC, Sec 892)

HEADQUARTERS, THIRD UNITED STATES ARMY
SUPPLEMENTAL INSTRUCTIONS TO ORDERS

A. Individual needing corrective eye lenses will be equipped with mask protective field M17 and necessary corrective eye lenses prior to departure from Continental US.

B. Personal mail will be addressed to unit of assignment.

C. Individual clothing will not be shipped as unaccompanied baggage but will accompany individual while in a transient status.

D. Does not reside within commuting distance.

E. Resides within commuting distance.

F. Authorized rations not available.

G. Authorized quarters not available.

H. Authorized allowance for quarters without dependents.

I. Authorized flight pay.

J. Authorized hazardous duty pay-parachute (jump status).

K. Individual is relieved from assigned Reserve unit upon entry on active duty.

L. Government transportation is not available.

M. Individuals who are ordered to active duty should report, in uniform, not later than 1200 hours on the reporting date shown on orders.

N. Special orientation is required in accordance with Third USA Regulation 360-26 prior to departure on permanent change of station from present unit.

O. Individuals ordered to extended active duty (other than for training) are entitled to transportation of dependents and shipment of household goods at Government expense, under certain conditions. For questions concerning shipment or storage of household goods and personal effects, contact the transportation officer at the nearest Army or Air Force installation.

P. The home of record as shown in orders will be recorded as permanent residence at time of order to active duty. The home of record may not be changed while on active duty insofar as mileage, pay, and allowances are concerned at time of separation. Therefore, if the home of record or current location is a place other than that shown in orders, immediately notify this HQ, ATTN: AJAAG-R, of the correct address so that orders may be amended prior to entry on active duty.

Q. Travel by privately owned conveyance, if authorized, which may be included as active duty, will be computed on the basis of one day for 300 miles. For distances of less than 300 miles, one day is authorized for travel in excess of 150 miles.

R. The effective date of entry on active duty, the date on which pay will begin, will be determined at the first duty station based on the date required to travel from home or current location, by the mode of travel to be utilized, so as to arrive at the duty station on the reporting date specified. Individuals who commence travel earlier than the required date, do so at their own risk and will not be in an active duty status in case of injury.

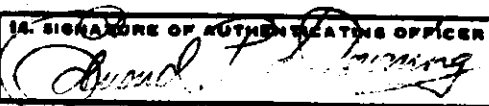

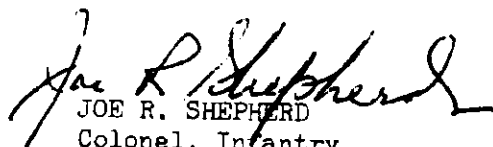

In connection with my appointment as a Reserve Officer of the Army, I hereby acknowledge that I understand completely the following:

That, if called upon to serve in the Active Army for a period of two years, I will incur an obligation to serve for a total of six years on active duty and in a reserve component; that upon relief from active duty I will be required to serve as a member of the Ready Reserve for a period which, when added to my period of active duty, totals five years; and that upon completion of a total of five years in the Active Army and in the Ready Reserve I will be transferred to the Standby Reserve for the remaining year of my obligation unless I complete an agreement to remain in the Ready Reserve. I further understand that during my service as a member of the Ready Reserve, I may be required to attend not less than forty-eight (48) scheduled drills or training periods and not more than seventeen (17) days active duty for training annually as prescribed or modified in current regulations or, in the alternative, may be required to perform thirty (30) days active duty for training annually, as determined by the Department of the Army; that failure to perform required training in any year may result in my being ordered to perform additional active duty for training for forty-five (45) days for that year, and, if necessary, having my membership in the Ready Reserve extended involuntarily for that purpose.

That, if not required to serve on active duty for two years, I will incur an obligation to serve in a reserve component for a period of eight years; that I will be required to perform not less than three (3) months or more than six (6) months on active duty for training upon the completion of which I will be required to participate in the Ready Reserve for the remainder of my obligation. I further understand that during my period of required participation in the Ready Reserve, I may be required to attend not less than forty-eight (48) scheduled drills or training periods and not more than seventeen (17) days active duty for training annually as prescribed or modified in current regulations or, in the alternative, may be required to perform not more than thirty (30) days active duty for training as determined by the Department of the Army; that failure to perform required training in any year can result in my commission being revoked and my being reported to Selective Service for induction into the Active Forces.

That, if, by virtue of prior active or reserve service, I do not incur a six-year obligation under paragraph 2 above, or an eight-year obligation under paragraph 3 above, I will be required to serve or participate actively in the military service for a period of four (4) years from date of my commission. Dependent upon the requirements of the Army such service will be performed either on active duty, active duty for training, by active participation in a reserve component, or by a combination of these forms of duty and participation.

I understand that each year during my period of participation in the Ready Reserve, I may be required to attend not less than forty-eight (48) scheduled drills or training periods and not more than seventeen (17) days active duty for training as prescribed or modified in current regulations or, in the alternative, may be required to perform not more than thirty (30) days active duty for training as determined by the Department of the Army; that failure to perform satisfactory Reserve service in any one year can result in my being ordered to perform additional active duty for training for forty-five (45) days for that year; and that failure to carry out orders to perform the forty-five (45) day period of additional active duty for training may render me subject to disciplinary action under the Uniform Code of Military Justice.

That, if I receive an appointment as a Reserve Officer of the Army upon successful completion of the courses prescribed in a military college the curriculum of which is approved by the Secretary of Defense under section 6(a) of the UMT&S Act, I will be required to serve on active training and service in the Active Army and in the Ready Reserve for a total of six years, unless sooner discharged on the grounds of personal hardship, in accordance with the provisions of subsection 4(d)(3) of the UMT&S Act, as amended by the Reserve Forces Act of 1955. I further understand that while a member of the Ready Reserve, I may be required to participate in not less than forty-eight (48) scheduled drills or training periods and to perform not more than seventeen (17) days of active duty for training during each year, or to perform annually not more than thirty (30) days of active duty for training; that for failure to perform such training duty satisfactorily I may be ordered, without my consent, to perform additional active duty for training for not more than forty-five (45) days, and that if such failure occurs during the final year of my period of obligatory membership in the Ready Reserve such membership shall be extended for such time, not to exceed six (6) months, as may be required for the performance of such additional active duty for training, in accordance with section 208(f), Armed Forces Reserve Act of 1952, as added by the Reserve Forces Act of 1955.

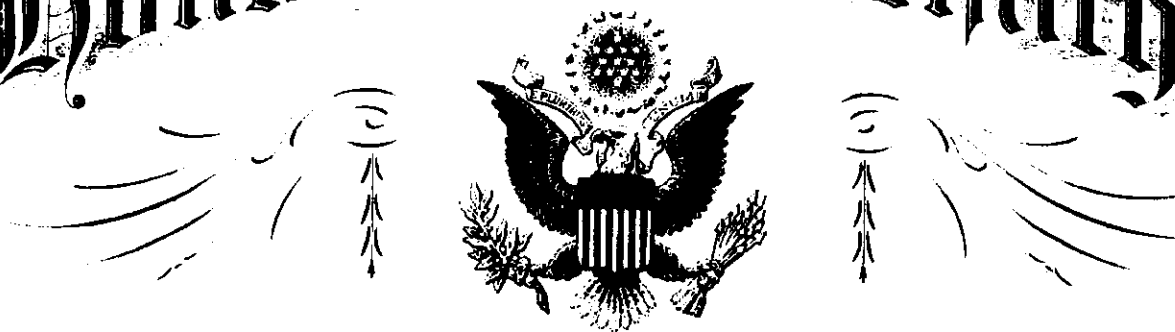
