The tables in this booklet are presented in a slightly different form from that of the original document prepared by the Ministry of Education. The "areas" designated in the tables conform to US AID organization and are not part of the RIG administration which, for the supervision of elementary schools, divides the country into 21 school districts or "inspections". Each district (except, presently, the province of Phong Saly) has a Primary School Inspector responsible for the operation and development of all elementary schools.

The 1965-66 school year opened in Laos with the following increase in students, schools, and teachers over the previous year:

The 1965-66 figures are as of November 15, 1965 and can be expected to rise considerably as the school year progresses.

The Lao government is making progress in extending the public school system throughout the country but still less than half of the children of school age are enrolled. The government must respond to political and social pressures for additional classrooms, the greatest pressure now being for additional primary schools. A need is also being felt for more classrooms on the upper elementary level, and this need will certainly increase within the next few years. Already, many schools in the larger towns are operating on double sessions.

It is important to recognize the heavy concentration of students in the first three grades of the system. Although figures are not yet available for the grade placement of the

154,000 elementary students, it is certain that more than three-quarters of them are enrolled in classes below the fourth grade. Not until these students reach the upper elementary level can they be said to have an adequate level of literacy or a satisfactory foundation for further academic or vocational training.

Of the 143,000 students enrolled in elementary schools last year, only 4,325 passed the examination for the sixth grade "C.E.P." certificate. Clearly, there is a need to concentrate efforts on setting more students into upper elementary grades and to complete the C.E.P. examination.

The ministry's figure of 2661 elementary schools should be qualified by the fact that 786 of these are presently closed. This is largely due to the political situation in many parts of the country but also, in some cases, to a lack of teachers. The construction of new schools, by both self-help efforts and by contract, is proceeding at the rate of roughly 250 new classrooms per year, though many of these are replacements for old or temporary structures.

The public school system now employs about 3000 regular teachers who are actually assigned to classroom teaching and about 700 volunteer "CREC" teachers. The four teacher training schools in the country now have approximately 1600 students enrolled.

2,500,000 copies of over 50 elementary textbooks in the Lao language are being printed and distributed to all school children. School supplies and teaching materials are made available to the schools through the Primary School Inspectors.

DEFINITION OF TYPES OF PUBLIC ELEMENTARY SCHOOLS

- Groupe Scolaire:** an elementary school with six grades and designated by the Ministry of Education as qualified to conduct a complete elementary course. The director of a groupe scolaire is a sub-administrator under the Primary School Inspector with responsibilities for a number of primary or CREC schools in his area.
- Demi-Groupe Scolaire:** an elementary school with more than three grades but usually less than six and not yet recognized by the ministry as a full groupe scolaire.
- Primary School:** a village school which usually has the first three grades. The teacher in this school would be a qualified ministry employee.
- CREC School:** ("Centre Rural d'Education Communautaire") a Village school, often with only one grade but sometimes reaching Grade Three. The teacher in this school may be a bonze or village volunteer who receives a small monthly allowance from the ministry.
