SUBJECT: Monthly Report for October 1973

I. ACTIVITIES

1. Our enrollment as of 25 October is as follows:

2. Two HI curriculum planners were sent to visit the north of the school. They visited the school and the school garden.
3. Our upland rice (100% of kind) is being planted in the agricultural field. Arrangements are being made for no border and partial foot-operated irrigation. Vegetable seedlings started in the school garden will be used for field transplanting next week.
4. The soybean and long bean demonstration plots planted by the provincial agricultural staff are being visited by the school garden staff.
5. Fruit trees for the demonstration plot will be purchased from either Bangkok or Chiang Mai.
6. Information sheets on the installation and maintenance of the water supply system and the water supply system are being translated into Thai at the school garden in the school garden at Crisfield.
7. The AFs for school furniture are being checked. The kitchen was checked as of 31 October.

8. The 7 bicycle racks made during the summer hold all 150 bicycles in neat, upright rows and the chain road blocks effectively contain cars and motor bikes in the parking area.
9. Mr. Donnelly, Chief/PWD, made an inspection tour of the school accompanied by Duke and Bewetz on the 15th.
10. Ambassador Charles Whitehouse is scheduled to visit Fa Ngum LP on Wednesday 31st.

II. PROBLEMS:

Fa Ngum LP is short 8 teachers as of this reporting date - 1 for 1st literature, 2 social studies, 2 English, 1 agriculture, 1 literature and a part-time French teacher. Soan, English teacher, is expected to complete his VIPL training in Singapore and return in late November. An English teacher Dong Do and a grantee from Sangpra Agric. College assigned to LP have not yet reported. Director heng himself teaches 18 hours per week.

Excessive wear and tear of the impeller caused by the abrasive action of silt and sand thrown up with the water has necessitated the 3 inch hole irrigation pump. The pump has been in use for 7 months of use. Because this will be a problem, the pump will be replaced with a "t" motor which requires a 1700 RPM motor.
