PROGRAMS:

Programs to clear the campus at Dong Dok of weeds and brush are being initiated. Two sprayers and a quantity of weed killer has been obtained. The agriculture adviser for the Garrison was consulted and a portable torch to burn the brush over the fence lines has been ordered. This work is being scheduled so that the maintenance staff at Dong Dok will be able to take care of this on a continuing basis without additional assistance.

A project of installed water lines to the girls' dormitories from the surface water ponds has been started at Dong Dok. This will provide a source of water for bathing and washing clothes the same as has been provided for the boys' dormitories. This should relieve the deep well system where there is presently only one existing well with no back-up available. The well drilling rig is scheduled to begin drilling for a back-up well during the second week of April. An additional deep well pump will be needed if the man which is still in the well that caved in in January cannot be recovered. Mr. Fry of PWD states that he has some special jacking equipment which is now available for attempting to recover this pump.

Work is continuing on causing the various areas within the campus at Dong Dok. Parking lots have been provided but cars and motorcycles being driven over the sidewalks and paths are still causing some serious problems during school hours.

The well drilling rig is presently at the Fa Ngum School site. The well to be drilled there is scheduled to be completed the first week of April. It is hoped that this well along with a ground water level indicator will take care of the problem of insufficient water as reported in last month's report.

A representative Mr. Fitzgerald of Phnom Penh during this reporting period has made a request for assistance for the girls' school camp. He was with the 97 and the school director. An inspection of the school. A report of this visit and recommendations were submitted to the Garrison on 15 April. After this year will be the second fully in Phnom Penh. Therefore, it was suggested that any assistance be given to this project.

Work has been started on a report on Vocational Education for Lee. Mr. Robert Longeneck of 2200 Chatham is writing the report with assistance from myself and Mr. James Gelman. This report should be completed April 6, 1978.
