

The Report, which is now being duplicated, includes professional presentations, school district reports, and summaries of curricular work accomplished during the Conference. It is planned to distribute the document next month.

The Activity Proposal to train ICM? BBS? and refugee teachers next summer is now in the approval process.

Miss Engler has developed a highly interactive table in her Monthly Report which outlines in detail the FY 72 CE in-service training activities. Seven types of training throughout the district will serve over 1,200 NCV staff members.

3. Participant Training

Four candidates for special training in Thailand were enrolled in the last cycle of BBS Pre Academic Training. Two of the nominees, Budget and Fiscal and Testing-Guidance completed the course and will be departing for the next Thai academic school year.

An additional two candidates for language arts are under consideration for four year Thai Ba programs.

4. Education Statistics - Primary Department

The Community Education Branch completed a translation and careful review of the Department of Primary Education Statistics. The figures this year follow the same general format of prior year reports except that private school statistics are much more complete. It should be noted that the Department of Primary Education has shown continual growth and improvement in the collection, tabulation, and interpretation of statistics.

6. Adult Literacy

The Department of Primary Education is sponsoring and conducting a training program for adult literacy leaders at San Antonio Training Center. Thirty trainees will complete training next month and set up projects widely on the Southern Plain. Two trainees are from San Jose) Sal and they will set up projects in their area.

Mr. Krumpholtz, Director of Primary Education, and Mr. Sonthong, PSI/Medical and Dr. Bentley, PSI Vang Vieng, attended a one week seminar on primary education at UNICEF, Singapore. A copy report will be sent to USAID when available.

8. Operations

CFA/Operations spent the majority of the reporting period making field visits and assisting local officials carry out their programs.

In Savannakhet the Na Song Group's Jenkine urban self help project will begin early in March. Local officials in Thakhek still plan to begin their project at Na So Group's Suokire.
