SUBJECT: Meeting Report, July 1971

Problem:

None.

Findings:

1. All of the present project summer activities, i. e., in-service and summer work activities involving principally teachers and students together with the project for the proposed New York Intensive English program course which was to be given to the top 150 English teachers nationwide. The 150 was cancelled because recruitment yielded only 17 candidates of which 17 were accepted. The remaining 18 positions that are needed to complete the new class will be selected in September.

The methods chosen for teaching the remainder will vary for three units for 30 graduates of the Buddhist Revolution. These 30 teachers will be assigned to the secondary and teacher training schools in October.

The 150 teachers will be selected as the remainder of the 330 selected in the summer of 1970 and will be the 150 best teachers present. The 150 positions will be filled by the end of the instructional time of the first day of the workshop. A highlight of the workshop will be the work of the 150 that described and illustrated the teacher in the future. The 150 will be selected from the 150 best teachers in the country.

3. The shipping of school supplies to each DIT for the preparation for school opening in October was continued.
4. Implementation of a plan for the refurbishing of the BIL/Vientiane Remuneration school began.

6. One of the first assignments for the recently created Lao Royal Academy is to review the report that was prepared at the project sponsored workshop in Luang (April 18 - 28) on the Lao language. Recommendations were made in the report for up-dating the rules of grammar.

7. Two projects began construction of the two dormitory buildings of 10 beds each. The first building is now 80% complete. The second building at the DIT/DIT is now 75% complete.
8. Project personnel performed scheduled work by field travel during this report period. Field trips included visits to Savannakhet (2), Luang Prabang, Vientiane, Ban Khou, and Xiang.
