one who leave a message in your phone. I also have brothe and sister who jest  
came to the U.S 2 yeas a go. All of as is not resident of the U.S. We don't  
have any chance to leave the country like orther Lao family untill now.

I'm applying for Asylum to stay in the U.S.  
I have to see the immigration Judge in the Denver court on June 09, 1999 to  
open case. at 8:00 am  
Do you thingk it is ok to telling them the my dad and you work together at  
Agency Internationl Development ( USIAD) taking helicopters of rice and food  
, medical and get school to the refugees fleeing the fighting.

My Dad whant you to know about this.  
We so grate to hear from you Mr. Larry Woodson.  
My dad want to live here, U.S , but we don't know how . My case still in the  
court.  
My dad will send some information by mail to you. my mom and one sister still  
in LAO, as communist country.
