I have been working in Laos with the International Voluntary Services for the past three years. During that time I have been associated with the teacher-training schools both as a teacher and as a supervisor of teachers. I have worked with visual aids workshops and agricultural education during my stay here.

While working with education in Laos, I have met several professors on the University Of Hawaii staff that have told me about the university and some of the programs offered there.

I would like to continue my studies in agriculture education with emphasis on tropical agriculture. I would like to follow a non-thesis program that would permit me to take course work in the following areas: language, S.E. Asian Cultures, education and agriculture.

I would like to correspond with the University's Counseling Center in order to find out if the type of program that I am interested in is available at the University of Hawaii.

Our Graduate Bulletin, which has been mailed to you, would probably be of greater help.

I plan to spend several more years in S.E. Asia, therefore would like to continue my studies in the areas previously mentioned in order to be of more service to the emerging countries of this part of the world.

I realize that my application is late and it is due to the recommendation of DWane R. Collins, Chief of Party for the University of Hawaii's Technical Assistance Contract to USAID-Laos that I take a chance in hopes that you will consider my application this year rather than wait until next year.

It is not late for Fall 1968 admission.
