A Peace Denied

*The United States, Vietnam,
and the Paris Agreement*

A Peace Denied is the first authoritative postwar analysis of the negotiations for peace in Vietnam. Porter traces the diplomatic history of the Vietnam conflict to the Paris Agreement of January 25, 1973, and shows why it failed to end the war. Drawing on interviews, the Pentagon Papers, and previously unpublished Vietnamese sources, he sketches in the first three chapters the diplomatic, military, and political strategies of the two sides up to the Spring Offensive of 1972. Chapters 4 and 5 detail the final phase of the negotiations through the October draft agreement, Nixon's refusal to sign before the election, the breakdown of negotiations following new demands by Kissinger, the bombing of Hanoi, and finally the return to the October document. Chapters 6-8 show how the failure of the Agreement to stop the war was the inevitable result of the continuity of American policy.
