MINISTER BINH WARNS U.S., CITES CONDITIONS FOR END TO WAR

Warns U.S. Against Intervention

London REUTER in English 2230 GMT 27 Mar 75 WA

[Excerpt] Algiers, March 27, REUTER--Mrs. Nguyen Thi Binh, foreign minister of the Provisional Revolutionary Government of South Vietnam, today warned the United States against any new intervention in the war there.

Asked if a risk of such intervention existed, Mrs. Binh said on arriving here for a visit: "We believe the United States, before launching itself on any new venture, should reflect on the consequences of such a maneuver.

"Whatever it undertakes, it must not forget that the relationship of forces will always be in our favor."

Mrs. Binh, who was welcomed by Algerian Foreign Minister Abdel Aziz Bouteflike, described the military situation in South Vietnam as good in that there had been important victories.

"On the other hand, it has a particularly serious side, the United States (?is) doing its utmost always to sabotage the Paris agreements," she added.

[Excerpt] Will the Calvary of Vietnam last any longer? Madame Nguyen Thi Binh, the Provisional Revolutionary Government's foreign minister, was in Algiers yesterday. For the war to stop, she explained, Thieu and his clique must be overthrown, the United States end its intervention, and a new administration ready to apply the Paris agreements must be installed in Saigon.
