AFP CITES VO DONG GIANG'S 29 MAR REMARKS ON NEGOTIATIONS

[Text] Saigon, March 29 (AFP)--Colonel Vo Dong Giang, representative here of the Provisional Revolutionary Government (PRG), said categorically today that "there cannot be any possible agreement with (South Vietnamese) President Nguyen Van Thieu."

At his weekly press conference, Col. Giang refused to comment on suggestions about forming a government of national union in Saigon. The suggestions had been made on Thursday by Father Tran Huu Thanh and General Nguyen Cao Ky, a former prime minister.

"I have received from my government no opinion on the personality of Gen Ky or about his recent activities," the colonel remarked. "The position of the PRG is unchangeable," he added.

"Thieu and his clique must be overthrown, the United States must put an end to its intervention, and a new administration prepared to apply the Paris agreements seriously must be set up in Saigon. "Only then will the PRG negotiate with such an administration to reestablish peace in South Vietnam."

Col. Giang refused to specify which people the PRG meant when it spoke of the "Thieu clique." He did say, however "They are not many, for in South Vietnam, even inside the Saigon administration, there are people who are for peace, reconciliation and national harmony." "The Thieu clique includes all those bellicose and stubborn elements which follow in the tracks of the United States and Thieu to maintain American neo-colonialism in South Vietnam, working counter to the aspirations of the South Vietnamese people," Col. Giang said.

He also told his press conference that "no North Vietnamese division is taking part in the current offensive" in South Vietnam, which he described as "a natural uprising of the people against repression and barbarity."
