2. Purpose:

- a. To provide guidance for the conduct of Scout Dog Training.
- b. To outline responsibilities and establish procedures for the accomplishment of training and maintenance of required operational readiness posture.

c. To provide guidance for accomplishment of support mission for the US Army Infantry Center.

3. Mission:

a. Conduct Infantry Scout Dog Program as directed by this headquarters.

b. Train to the highest possible degree and further unit operational readiness posture, commensurate with assigned support mission.

c. Provide maximum support to the US Army Infantry Center.

4. Installation Support:

a. Support the US Army Infantry School by furnishing demonstration troops and equipment as authorized by current Modified Table of Organization and Equipment (MTOE).

b. Provide other support personnel as requested by this headquarters.

c. When USAIC missions conflict or require additional effort, changes to support requirements will be made by this headquarters.

5. Training:

a. Infantry Scout Dog Program:

(1) Activate, train and deploy TOE Infantry Platoons (Scout Dog).

(2) Receive, train and deploy Replacement Packets, Infantry Platoons (Scout Dog).

(3) Receive and train United States Marine Corps Scout Dog Platoons and Replacement Packets.

(4) Receive and train, within unit capabilities, special groups and/or individuals in accordance with directives from higher headquarters.

b. Unit Training: The training objective is to attain and maintain the highest state of operational readiness. As a minimum, the following training will be accomplished by all units.

(1) POR, POM and mandatory training: Reference 1f and para 27 and Annex B, reference 1i.
