It was known they could do nothing when the North Vietnamese took power. The G.R.P is nothing now and you American people you delude yourselves in believing you could go on in supporting Quik Quik Hospital. You should know what is Communism. South Vietnam is not free anymore and I doubt you could help again - I was told not to go and speak with the G.R.P in Paris. It should not be good for Ed & George to call attention on them.

I'm going to write to the International Red Cross in Geneva, they are the only one who could help at the present time.

I would like to know more about Ed & George. Could you send me some information. It should be asked by Geneva, I'm sure. (birth date, when they arrived in Vietnam, their addresses in U.S.A & New Zealand, who employed them) Give me information about Kerry, also.

Claudine, one of the nurses in Ban-
me Thout and who was taken by the V.C.
came back from Saigon two weeks ago. I
met her last week. It was reported that
Ed & George were in a working camp near
Pleiku, but she knows nothing more.
I'll write again as soon as I get some
news from Geneva. If you have a time
and if you know, send me Dorian &
Serina's addresses.

I am very sad about all what
happens to South Vietnam and to your family.
I hope your son is a comfort for you.

I am very fond of Quik Quik and
I miss all those nice fellows I worked
with.

I plan to go to U.S.A before one year
I don't know when exactly. I should be

pleased to meet you - I'm going to think a
bite more about this trip.

I wrote to Phyllis about I don't think she
will be able to go back to Vietnam.
