WESTERN STAFF EVACUATED FROM KONTUM HOSPITAL;

The Work Goes on

Last Monday evening's newspaper headlines read "Saigon Pulls Out of Pleiku, Gives Up Central Highlands". Dr. Pat's hospital is at Kontum, one of the three provinces in the central highlands. As the result of the South Vietnamese decision that it was impossible to defend this area, Dr. Pat, her sons Det and Wir, and all the Western staff at the hospital were evacuated to Saigon. Until word

reached Seattle late Monday night, the status of the staff and the hospital was not known. A phone call assured local parents and friends that all were safe. Dr. George Christian and Dr. Ed Baker, chose to stay to carry on the overwhelming work of the care of 340 inpatients at Kontum Hospital, assisted by well-trained native nurses and aides.

Peggy Braile and Mary Reigel, Seattle nurses arrived for a year's service in Vietnam only two months ago, are uncertain as to the situation regarding their passports. Dr. Pat has sent word that for now and for as long as it looks feasible, she will set up and work in a clinic on the edge of Saigon to treat the thousands of wounded and ill natives who are streaming into the city.

President's Letter

I could hardly believe what I was reading in Dr. George Christian's last "missal" from Kontum. He wrote to tell us of the conditions he found upon his return to Kontum from the States in January. The most startling statistic was that of the 340 inpatients at the hospital, 50% to 60% were children, mostly under six years old.

The trustees on the board had asked Dr. Christian to tell us of the most critical needs at the hospital and their costs. As a result of the findings, we are going to increase our monthly allocation to operational expenses at the hospital by \$500 a month. The food fund will be increased by \$500 a month and a long time dream of Dr. Pat's, a pediatric unit, will be started into realization. I am going to suggest the project title, PUP. What is more lovable to a child than a puppy? In this case a \$30,000 pup, a Pediatric Unit for Pat. We will need your help so write and let us know if you can assist us with this goal.

Report From Kontum

Until the situation changed in Vietnam for Dr. Pat's hospital last weekend, word from Dr. George Christian and John Havican at the hospital was that all was quiet thus far. The hospital was caring for 340 patients, the highest number ever to be at Kontum at one time. Six nurses, not Montegnards, were on duty. The large number of cases perhaps, was the result of the unusually warm winter that Kontum had had, increasing the incidence of malaria. Dr. Christian and Dr. Pat have agreed that the most pressing need at Kontum is for a pediatric ward so that the ill children may be served in their own area. The food fund could stand bolstering because the cost of rice has risen 50% since 1973. Dr. Pat estimates that there are about 75,000 people in Kontum and the surrounding area.

A check for \$13.43 arrived at the Kontum office in Seattle this month — sent by a waitress, Jennie, 60 years old, in Spokane. She sends her tips to the missions and as a result of hearing about Dr. Pat, chose to send it to her. A most generous gift from an unselfish giver.
