The village unit political commissar and leader must base themselves on this basis to build democratic, collective work methods along with clearly determining the division of labor and functions. Concretely, concerning the military resolution of the village leadership organization and the instructions and orders of the district unit, the village unit political commissar and leader must join in discussing them and in organizing their implementation. Should an important, urgent problem arise without a resolution being issued by the village leadership organization, the village unit political commissar and leader must together uphold the sense of responsibility and seek to satisfactorily fulfill their task. Relying on the community, every cadre must pay attention to correctly and satisfactorily fulfilling his tasks. The village unit political commissar will be in charge of political and ideological problems, and the village unit leader will be in charge of military matters, such as assuming command over combat operations, exerting leadership over training, deploying forces, and so forth.

Question: What is the relation between the village unit political commissar and branches and mass organization in the village?

Answer: It is a relation among the components of an engine--a relation of work coordination placed under the concentrated, unified command of the village leadership organization--aimed at systematically mobilizing all people to fight the enemy and to participate in building the armed forces of the revolution. In order to consolidate and satisfactorily build his relation with various branches, the village unit political commissar must uphold the spirit of taking initiative, meeting, and discussion, while having the [words indistinct] viewpoint. The village unit political commissar should bear in mind not only the requirements of the military task and, thereby, belittle other tasks. He must, especially, maintain close relations and closely coordinate with the People's Revolutionary Youth Group, the Liberation Womens Association, the security branch, and so forth, which are organizations charged with heavy responsibilities in military matters.

Question: What is the common goal of these relations?

Answer: Apart from these relations, the village unit political commissar still has many other relations, such as his relation with the people in the village, his relation with cadres, combatants, militiamen, and guerrillas, his relation with friendly villages, his relation with main force units, when they come to localities, and so forth. Although the nature and contents of each relation are different from one another, the common aim is the same. This aim is: To consider victory over the enemy and the fulfillment of tasks as a goal, to consider revolutionary viewpoints and lines as an ideological base, to consider the system of leadership of the revolution a principle of action, to consider the submission to organizations and discipline as a condition, and to consider practice and concrete requirements and tasks as a basis.
