BIOGRAPHIC INFORMATION ON HA THI QUE

Hanoi PHU NU VIETNAM in Vietnamese 15-21 Oct 80 p 5

[Article: "Ha Thi Que"]

[Text] Ha Thi Que was born in 1921 in Quynh Luu Village, Hoang Long District, Ha Nam Ninh Province. Educated by her family, she developed revolutionary awareness at a young age and performed liaison work in 1936 and 1937.

In 1939, she joined the Youth Union and the Women's Union, serving as secretary of the village Women's Union Chapter. In early 1940, she became a member of the district Women's Union Executive Committee. In late 1940, she was accepted into the Indochina Communist Party.

She was appointed to the Cadre Affairs Section of the district party organization; then, she was sent by the provincial party organization to work in Thai Binh and the interprovincial region of Ninh Binh-Ha Nam-Nam Dinh and subsequently appointed to the Cadre Affairs Section of the Security Zone party organization of the Party Central Committee.

In mid-1944, the Party Central Committee assigned her to the Cadre Affairs Section of the Bac Giang party organization and put her in charge of Yen The and Viet Yen Districts. She and her comrades became deeply involved in developing the mass movement, building the armed forces and preparing for the general uprising. She personally led guerrillas in surprise attacks on units of the Japanese fascist army that were attempting to destroy the revolution and were stealing rice from the people. She led attacks on the Bo Ha Post, the Yen The District seat and Yen The District and coordinated with neighboring districts to take over many posts and stations, kill bandits and eliminate spies.

In August 1945, she participated in leading the takeover of the government of Bac Giang Province. In the nationwide war of resistance, she was a member of the Standing Committee of the Bac Ninh Provincial Party Committee. In August 1947, she was assigned as secretary of the National Salvation Women's Union of Interzone 10, was a member of the executive committee of the Interzone party organization and later joined the party fraction of the Women's Union Central Committee.

At the 3rd Congress of the Vietnam Communist Party, she was elected to the Party Central Committee; later, she was elected to the Control Committee of the Party Central Committee, serving as its deputy chairwoman.

At the 4th Women's Congress, she was elected chairwoman of the Vietnam Women's Union.

In early 1980, on the basis of work requirements, the Central Committee of the Vietnam Communist Party elected her to the Central Control Committee of the party. She presently serves as deputy chairwoman of the Central Control Committee of the party.
