PRIVATE VISIT

Three United States foreign policy specialists left Bangkok in the New Year for a private visit to Laos, Vietnam and Cambodia. The group is led by former Democratic senator Dick Clark, and includes Tony Lake, director of policy planning at the State Department under the administration of former president Jimmy Carter, and Peter Tarnoff, another former foreign service officer and the executive director of the World Affairs Council of San Francisco. Tarnoff is also an adviser to democratic presidential candidate Walter Mondale. Before leaving Bangkok the three were scheduled to meet Thai Foreign Minister Siddhi Savetsila, the US Ambassador John Gunther Dean, and representatives of the anti-Vietnamese Coalition Government of Democratic Kampuchea.
