



COAT OF ARMS

The 2d Battalion 35th Infantry canton contains a giant Saguaro Cactus which represents the activation of the Regiment at Douglas, Arizona in 1916. The 35th Infantry was formed of personnel from three other Infantry Regiments which are also represented on the canton. The 11th Infantry is represented by a white maltese cross, the 18th Infantry by a red acorn, and the 22nd Infantry by the embattled partition line. The Walnut tree commemorates the baptism of fire at the Nogales Customs House in Arizona, during August 1918.
