THE 3RD PLATOON ^{IN A TRENCH} BEEN ON LINE MOVING NORTH PARALLEL
TO THAT TRENCH AND THE NVA WAITED UNTIL THEY WERE
ONLY A FEW YARDS AWAY BEFORE OPENING UP. A COUPLE
OF THE BODIES WERE PULLED INTO THE TRENCH, STRIPPED
OF WEAPONS AND PACKS. LOST RADIO, M-60, M-79 AND M16'S.
