1. SOVIET DIPLOMATS IN P'YONGYANG APPEAR UNHAPPY OVER THE STAND TAKEN BY THE DEMOCRATIC PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF KOREA (DPRK) IN THE TALKS HELD IN P'YONGYANG BETWEEN KAMPUCHEAN PRINCE SIHANOUK AND KHIEU SAMPHAN. THE SOVIETS MANIFESTED THEIR DISPLEASURE BY PROTESTING SIHANOUK'S BOOK "THE DEMOCRATIC PEOPLE'S REPUBLIC OF KOREA" WHICH WAS PUBLISHED IN 1980 BY THE FOREIGN LANGUAGES PUBLISHING HOUSE IN P'YONGYANG. SIHANOUK'S BOOK, WHICH CONTAINS A FOREWORD BY THE FAMOUS AUTHOR HAN SUYIN, IS FULL OF PRAISE FOR NORTH KOREA SO IT APPEARS TO HAVE BEEN WRITTEN TO THANK PRESIDENT KIM IL-SONG FOR HIS HOSPITALITY TO SIHANOUK. ITS LAST CHAPTER, HOWEVER, IS CRITICAL OF THE SOVIET UNION. AS A RESULT OF A SOVIET DEMARCHE MADE TO NORTH KOREAN PREMIER YI CHONG-OK WHEN HE VISITED MOSCOW, THE DPRK WITHDREW THE BOOK FROM CIRCULATION ON 6 MARCH 1981.
