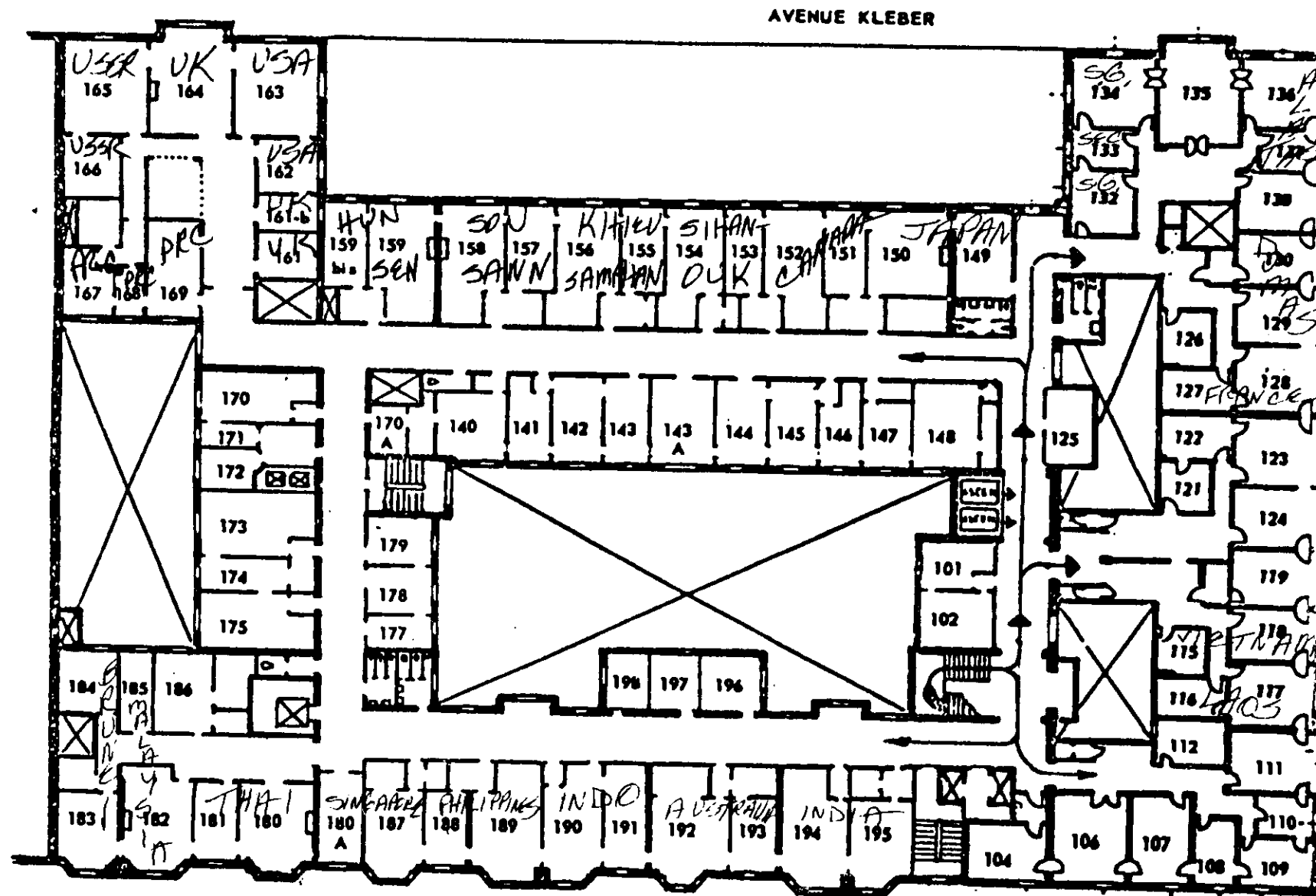

The task of the first Committee of the International Conference on Cambodia shall be to define the modalities of a ceasefire and the mandate, as well as the principles which shall guide the creation and the operations of an effective international mechanism in order to supervise and control a comprehensive implementation of the settlement (International Control Mechanism - I.C.M.).

1 - The terms of the cease-fire could be defined on the basis of the following elements :

- Day and time of implementation,
- Cease-fire proclamation and communication to the various levels of the armed forces.
- Rules governing the movement of troops after the cease-fire.
 - *Confinement (number of bases & location of bases)*
 - Regroupement of forces (timetable and modalities).
- Measure to be taken regarding troops and the various types of armements during the transitional period (force reductions , total or partial disarmament, including the removal and disposal of mines)
- Maintenance of law and order during the transitional period and possible assistance in that regard.

2 - The I.C.M mandate could include in any case the following elements :

(a) Supervision, control and verification of the complete withdrawal of foreign troops and their weapons and equipment from Cambodia according to a precise timetable and on agreed modalities.

(b) Control and verification of the non-return and the non-introduction of foreign forces.

(c) Supervision and control of the ceasefire and of the implementation of the measures to be taken in order to facilitate its enforcement.

(d) Supervision and control of the cessation of the external arm supplies to all the Cambodian parties, in particular through the supervision and control of land and river supply routes, ports and airports through which aid is supplied at present.

(e) In more general terms, monitoring the commitments to ensure the ~~cease-fire~~^{cessation} and the non recurrence of foreign interference which result from the future independant and neutral status of Cambodia.

(f) Monitoring and control of the return of previously disarmed elements of ~~cambodian~~^{Cambodian} forces stationed abroad, and supervision of the implementation of the arrangements to facilitate the ~~repatriation~~^{repatriation} of refugees and displaced persons in liaison with the relevant international organizations.

(g) Supervision and control, in co-operation with the cambodian quadripartite interim authority, of the organization and fairness of free, democratic and equitable elections establishing the legitimacy of the new State of Cambodia.

(h) Control and verification of the commitment and measures to be taken prevent the recurrence of genocidal policies and practices.

3 - The principles on which the I.C.M will be established may be defined through consideration of the following issues :

- . Modalities for creating the mechanism,
- . Duration of the mandate,
- . Criteria for selection of the participants,
- . Operational composition as required for the implementation of the mandate (civilian and military components fix and mobile team; corps of observers and other elements such as experts, military and police personnel, logistical echelon, etc ...),
- . Timetable for deployment of the entire mechanism,
- . Nature and modalities of relations with the vietnamese authorities in respect to the supervision and control of the withdrawal of foreign troops; nature of information to be provided by these authorities,
- . Nature and modalities of relations with the countries bordering Cambodia, as required by the implementation of the relevant aspects of the mandate,
- . Nature and modalities of the relations with the Cambodian authorities at the different stages of the settlement process,
- . The authority to which the I.C.M reports and, in general, the "chain of command" under which it operates,
- . Facilities to be granted to the I.C.M for its movements, observations activities, transportation and transmissions, in order to enable to perform its mandate without hindrance,
- . Status of the individuals or organizations authorized to submit complaints to the I.C.M, and corresponding procedures,
- . Follow-up to be given to any existing violations,
- . Financial questions.
