

At the Itazuke base, about 100 U.S. planes take off or land daily. The U.S. Phantom planes stationed at the base were alerted for urgent action. At the same time, there was intensified activity of U.S. military transport planes flying between Itzuke and the U.S. military bases at Yokota, Atsugi, Okinawa, and Guam.

#### Anti-U.S. Demonstration

[Text] Peking--The broad masses of Japanese students, workers, and other citizens in Fukuoka yesterday held meetings and demonstrations protesting against the crime of the U.S. Air Force whose fighter-bomber crashed into Kyushu University, burning down a building under construction, according to the TOHO news agency. The demonstrators also demanded removal of U.S. military bases.

A total of 7,000 students of the university held protest rallies yesterday afternoon in the principal and branch schools separately. After the rallies, the angry students marched to the U.S. Consulate and held a protest meeting there for over 2 hours. The demonstrators shouted: "Protest against the crime of the U.S. Armed Forces!" "Dismantle U.S. Air Force Itazuke base immediately!" and other anti-American slogans.

Yesterday evening, 3,000 workers and students gathered at a rally on the public square in front of the Fukuoka City Hall to demand removal of U.S. military bases. Members of the Fukuoka Prefectural headquarters of the Japan-China Friendship Association (Orthodox) also participated in this rally. They held placards inscribed with "Long live Mao Tse-tung's thought!" "Oppose imperialism and revisionism!" "Smash Japan-U.S. 'security treaty,'" and other slogans.

Speaking at the rally, Yanosuke Narazaki, Socialist Party Diet member, called on the participants immediately to rise up to fight for the abrogation of the Japan-U.S. "security treaty."

After the rally, workers, students, and activists in the Japan-China friendship movement marched to the U.S. "cultural center" in Fukuoka City. Large numbers of citizens joined this anti-U.S. demonstration, swelling the ranks of demonstrators to over 20,000.

#### THAI RADIO HAILS PEOPLE'S ARMED FORCE GROWTH

[Text] Peking--"The Voice of the People of Thailand" yesterday broadcast an article warmly hailing the growth of the Thai people's armed forces in the northeastern part of Thailand and their victories won under the leadership of the Communist Party of Thailand over the U.S.-Thai reactionaries.

The article said that the first shot of revolutionary armed struggle was fired by the Thai people under the leadership of the Communist Party of Thailand in Na Kae District, Nakon Phanom Province, in the northeastern part of Thailand, over 2 years ago. Since then the flames of the revolution have rapidly enveloped the whole country, and they are now raging in 30 out of the 71 provinces of the country.

The people's armed forces in the northeast, the article said, have been studying and applying Chairman Mao's strategy and tactics on people's war. Very often they divide into small groups to rouse the masses and concentrate their forces to ambush and attack the enemy.

NCNA COMMENTS ON SAIGON COMMAND POST 'ATTACK'

[Text] Peking--On 2 June a jittery U.S. helicopter fired a rocket into a command post of U.S.-puppets in Saigon, killing or wounding 10 high-ranking puppet officers and officials, according to a Saigon report.

This happened when the U.S.-puppet clique in Saigon was seized with great panic under the heavy blows of the heroic People's Liberation Armed Forces.

According to Western news reports, among the dead were Saigon puppet Police Director Nguyen Van Luan, "5th Ranger Task Force" Commander Dao Ba Phuoc, chief administrator of the Saigon puppet police Nguyen Ngoc Xinh, puppet commander of the 5th Saigon district Le Ngoc Tru, Saigon puppet Port Director Pho Quoc Tru, and puppet army officer Nguyen Bao Thuy.

Among the wounded were puppet Saigon Mayor Van Va Cua, deputy chief of the puppet "capital military district" Nguyen Van Giam, acting director of the puppet police Tran Van Phan, and another puppet official.

Such killings of lackeys by their U.S. master's bombs are commonplace in South Vietnam. At first the U.S. imperialists denied this incident because of its seriousness. But the U.S. "Embassy" in Saigon had to issue a statement yesterday admitting in vague terms that "it is possible" that the rocket was fired by an American helicopter.

JAPANESE REACT TO U.S. PLANE CRASH, BASES

Report of Crash, Protest

[Text] Tokyo--Last night a U.S. Phantom F-4C fighter-bomber crashed into Kyushu University in Fukuoka City, setting fire to the electronic computer building now under construction. This has aroused strong protest from the students of the university and other people in Japan.

The U.S. jet which took off from the U.S. air base at Itazuke was on a training flight for the U.S. war of aggression in Vietnam.

It was reported that about 1,000 students of the university and citizens of Kyushu rushed to the scene immediately after the accident and held a protest rally and demonstration against the U.S. crime. The students shouted with great indignation: "Yankees go home!" "Dismantle the Itazuke base!" "Oppose U.S. aggression against Vietnam!" and other slogans. The students also demonstrated in front of the U.S. consulate in Fukuoka City.

But the reactionary Sato government ruthlessly called out large numbers of armed police to suppress the students' protest action. When the angry students stormed a U.S. military patrol car arriving at the crash scene from the Itazuke base and struggled with the American servicemen, the Japanese police barbarously beat up the patriotic students who resolutely fought back the police outrage.

It was reported that U.S. imperialism, while perpetrating a "peace talks" fraud, had recently stepped up its military activities on certain war bases in Japan in support of its aggressive war in Vietnam.

They can mysteriously appear and disappear, enjoying perfect mobility. Therefore, the people's armed forces, though on the whole in an inferior position, have been able to annihilate the temporarily powerful enemy piecemeal by concentrating a superior force in each concrete battle and repeatedly smashing the enemy's counter-revolutionary "encirclement and suppression" campaigns. In the course of fighting, they have also expanded their own forces. According to preliminary statistics, the people's armed forces in the northeast have so far fought 490 battles with the enemy and wiped out over 1,200 troops and police of the U.S.-Thai reactionaries.

The article stressed that the people's armed forces in northeast Thailand have followed these teachings of Chairman Mao, the great teacher of the world revolutionary people: "The richest source of power to wage war lies in the masses of the people," and "the revolutionary war is a war of the masses; it can be waged only by mobilizing the masses and relying on them." The Thai people's armed forces take as their central task the rousing of the peasant masses and the unfolding of the revolutionary armed struggle in the countryside. According to incomplete figures, in the past year or more, the people's armed forces in the northeast sent out "armed propaganda teams" deep into the villages behind the enemy lines on 155 occasions to make propaganda and organize and arm the masses. These roving teams also punished spies, secret agents, and despotic landlords. This has greatly inspired the broad masses of the peasants, raised their class consciousness, and won their vigorous support.

The article said that the heroic people's armed forces in the northeast enjoy so intimate a relationship with the masses that they are like fish in the water. They have the all-out support of the revolutionary people of the whole country. Therefore, they advance from victory to victory. No matter what serious difficulties and twists and turns they may encounter in their revolutionary advance, the people's armed forces in northeast Thailand, under the leadership of the Communist Party of Thailand which holds high the great red banner of Marxism-Leninism, Mao Tse-tung's thought, will persevere in the people's war together with the revolutionary people of the whole country. #### MALIAN MILITARY DELEGATES VISIT PLA AIR UNIT

The guests were warmly greeted by the commanders and fighters of the unit on their arrival. The welcomers held portraits of Chairman Mao and President Keita and shouted "Long live the friendship between the people of China and Mali!"

A leading member of the unit told the Malian guests of its history. "Ours is a people's air force which has been formed in accordance with Chairman Mao's theory of army-building and serves the people wholeheartedly," he said.

The Malian friends visited an exhibition of clay sculptures showing the sufferings of the families of the PLA soldiers before liberation. They attended a performance given by a Mao Tse-tung's thought propaganda team and saw a display flight.

Minister delegate Mamadou Diakite praised the display flight and noted that China possessed up-to-date, powerful planes which were operated by men armed with Mao Tse-tung's thought. "We believe the Chinese people are invincible. This is a tremendous inspiration to the people of the world," he said. Moussa Coulibly, charge d'affaires ad interim of the Malian Embassy in Peking, was present during the visit.

#### AUSTRALIAN CP PAPER DENOUNCES SOVIET TRAITORS

[Text] Peking--VANGUARD, organ of the Australian Communist Party (Marxist-Leninist), published an article on 30 May denouncing the Soviet revisionist ruling clique for siding with U.S. imperialism and world reaction as shameful renegades in face of the vigorous revolutionary struggle of the people the world over.

The article warmly hails the struggle of the Vietnamese people against U.S. imperialism and for national salvation, the Afro-American struggle against violent repression, and the struggle of the French people, and then points out: "The Soviet Khrushchevites oppose each of them."

On the Vietnam question, the article continues, the Soviet revisionist ruling clique has, in coordination with the counterrevolutionary tactics of U.S. imperialism to peddle the "peace talks" hoax, given the latter a breathing space to recover from its shattering defeat. "In Vietnam the Soviet Khrushchevites show themselves to be the number one traitors," it said.

It went on: "The Soviet Khrushchevites condemn the struggle of the black people in the United States as lawless. They call for peaceful demonstrations. They say the black people should be patient. They say that when the Vietnamese war is over the U.S. rulers will use the 20 billion annual expenditure on the war to alleviate the lot of the black people. Thus they are number one traitors to the U.S. black people."

It noted: "In France the Soviet Khrushchevites and the local French Khrushchevites condemn the French students and workers. They want the struggle confined to law and order. Thus to the French people the Soviet Khrushchevites are number one traitors."

The article points out that it is particularly important to understand the utter and despicable treachery of these people since they carry out their treachery under the cover word of "communism."

#### ARAB PEOPLE'S STRUGGLE AGAINST U.S. RAGES

[Text] As instructed by the Americans, the Thanom-Prapchat clique, on the one hand, has given more service to the Americans in invading Vietnam. It not only allows the Americans to use Thailand as their base of aggression against Vietnam, but plans to send 10,000 more Thai troops to serve the Americans in their war of aggression in South Vietnam soon. On the other hand, the Thanom-Prapchat clique has also increasingly stepped up its harassment of Vietnamese refugees in Thailand by forcing some Vietnamese refugees here to go to the U.S.-controlled areas in South Vietnam against their will without listening to the protests of the DRV and the Vietnamese refugees, or to the opposition and condemnation of the Thai people.

Late last month, Prasert, chief of the fascist police of the Thanom-Prapchat clique, reaffirmed that the clique would forcibly send the Vietnamese refugees detained at the Lad Bua Khao concentration camp, Nakhon Ratchasima, to South Vietnam. The first batch of 90 men will be sent soon. Prasert also disclosed that these Vietnamese refugees will be detained in U.S. concentration camps in South Vietnam and undergo the so-called "rehabilitation orientation" first--the method to compel the Vietnamese refugees to betray their motherland by yielding to serve the Americans and their lackeys. This depraved plan has been designed by the Americans. The Thanom-Prapchat clique openly admits that the expenses of the transportation will be financed by the Americans.

The depraved plan of the Thanom-Prapchat clique to send Vietnamese refugees to South Vietnam on the instructions of the Americans will be opposed by the Vietnamese, Thai, and all peace-loving and revolutionary peoples. The patriotic and justice-loving Thai people will stand fast to support the just struggle of these Vietnamese refugees and oppose the U.S.-Thanom-Prapchat clique's criminal plans to invade and harass the Vietnamese people.

#### COMMUNIST ACTIVITY REPORTED LOWEST IN 2 YEARS

[Text] --by Prasong Wittaya--Communist activities last week dropped to the lowest ebb during the past 2 years, according to the Communist Suppression Operations Command. Two communists were killed during clashes with government units--one in Nakae district, Nakhon Phanom, and the other in Ban Bangkha, Thoeng district, Chiang Rai Province in the north. The announcement said 13 terrorists were arrested and 17 surrendered. Many of them were wounded, especially in the Chiang Rai skirmish. The officials seized several documents and weapons.

In the northeast, about 15 armed terrorists forced villagers in a small hamlet called Ubmung, Muang district, Udonrthani, close to Sakol Bakhon Province, to attend a meeting during which they attacked government policies and, as usual, gave false promises to the people.

Another report said communist activities are continuing among the refugees from North Vietnam who have been residing in the northeast for more than 10 years. These activities are being concentrated in provinces along the Mekong River. Efforts are being made to subvert Vietnamese born in Thailand, the report added.

From the south, reports from Yala Province said three policemen were killed and three seriously injured when Communist Chinese border terrorists ambushed police units in village No 6, Tambol Yarom, Betong district, last Sunday. The 10-man police unit was ambushed while on its way to a house where the terrorists planned to collect food supplies. The unit, with border patrol and provincial police, returned the terrorists' fire. The gunbattle lasted about half an hour, the reports said. Two border patrol policemen were killed instantly. A Betong policeman died of injuries in Betong Hospital. There were no reports from other communist terrorist infested areas, such as Pattalung and Narsarn. During the week, Prime Minister Thanom Kittikhachon told a press conference: "I feel activities are greatly reduced now due to the efficient suppression work which is being carried out. We have sent communist suppression forces to all areas making it increasingly difficult for the communists to carry out their activities." The Prime Minister also noted that the people are also cooperating more and more with official units.

Although the situation in this northernmost province has calmed down, Governor Choo Sa-nga Chaiyaphan warned that it is still a potential trouble spot. One of the busiest governors in the country, Mr. Choo Sa-nga has to deal with normal administrative procedures, cooperate with the military in suppressing communist terrorists, help resettling hilltribes in [word indistinct] and direct accelerated rural development program work.

He reported early this month that one of the large bands of Meo hill tribesmen have sent their chief to contact officials that some of his men would like to settle down in an area the government will provide. This pioneer group comprises about 50 families. "More will follow if the first group is treated well," the governor added. He reiterated the government's open arms policy. "We welcome all hill tribes to come and live with us in peace. We are ready to help them in any way possible."

Chiang Rai, with an area of 11,752,187.5 rai, is 949 kilometers north of Bangkok on the Phaholyothin highway (route 1). As of the end of last year the population was 1,009,912--the fourth largest in the kingdom. (Bangkok, Ubol Ratchathani and Nakhon Ratchasima top the list, respectively.)

According to official statistics, there are about 24,000 hilltribes people in the province. They are the Yaos, Meos, Egor, Muser, Lessor, and Karens. As the crow flies, the province is only 120 kilometers south of mainland China's border it has a 120-kilometer common border with Burma along the rugged terrain in the north, and on the east the province shares the rough borderline with Laos for more than 180 kilometers until it reaches Nan Province.

It is in this area close to the Laos border that the communist terrorists, exploiting the Meo hill tribes, are threatening the peace and welfare of the people. The districts where the communists concentrate their activities are Thoeng, Chiengkham, Chiengkong, and Chiengsaen. There were also reports of communist activities in Maesai district bordering Burma in the north. The province has 15 districts and two subdistricts.

Chiang Rai leads all other provinces in the kingdom in rice production. It has 1.8 million rai of land for rice cultivation. Chiang Rai rice feeds part of Burma and Laos and other parts of the country. The double-cropping system has been introduced in some areas. Wheat farming is also under experiment. Other agricultural products making Chiang Rai famous include tobacco, maize, tapioca, sugarcane, cotton, potato, jute, and beans. "Generally, the people here are peace-loving and only Meo hilltribesmen exploited by the communists are causing troubles," Governor Choo Sangna said.

#### CLIQUE SELLS OUT COUNTRY TO UNITED STATES

##### Thai Troops to S. Korea

[Text] At a ceremony to send another group of Thai troops to help the Americans occupy South Korea on 6 June, Thanom, a U.S. lackey, once again lied to the soldiers saying that the reason the clique sends Thai troops to serve the U.S. occupation of South Korea and the U.S. war of aggression in Vietnam is to "defend" Thailand. He deceitfully urged the troops to give service to the Americans to the fullest extent in order to protect the clique's reputation of being a faithful U.S. lackey.

In connection with the sending of Thai troops to help the Americans occupy South Korea, Thanom used to say that the clique was not willing to do so for the expenses were too much. However, instructed by the Americans to do so, the clique had to send some troops there. This means that the clique is forced to send Thai troops to South Korea and that the troops' commitment has nothing to do with the defense of Thailand. It is generally known that among U.S. lackeys who used to send troops to South Korea under the pretext of the UN flag, only the Thanom-Praphat clique still regularly continues to send troops to help the Americans occupy South Korea.

As for sending Thai troops to serve the Americans in invading South Vietnam, Thanom and Praphat recently admitted that it depends on the Americans how many Thai troops should be sent and when. They also said that if it fulfilled the clique's aid request, it will send as many as possible. This clearly shows that the Thanom-Praphat clique sells out Thai troops to be used in invading Vietnam in order to trade them for U.S. dollars and weapons to be used in suppressing the Thai people. U.S. newspapers and magazines always say that the reason the Thanom-Praphat clique sends Thai troops to fight in South Vietnam is to trade them for U.S. dollars and weapons.

Thanom recently admitted that U.S. President Johnson had urged the clique to send more Thai troops to South Vietnam as soon as possible. This also clearly shows that the sending of Thai troops to South Vietnam by the Thanom-Praphat clique is carried out under the instruction and orders of the Americans so that it will get support from the Americans in suppressing the Thai people. Its action has nothing to do with the defense of Thailand as stated by Thanom. Therefore, Thai troops destined (?for South Korea:) you must oppose the clique's plan to trade your lives for the interests of the Thanom-Praphat clique by serving U.S. aggression.

##### U.S. Investment
