Sorry we did not reply to your request sooner. My husband, Elwood, had a severe nervous breakdown in 1977 and it is difficult for me to get too much information from him. I have gone through some of our records looking for dates and information. Rather than try to fill out your questionnaire, may I just tell you the things I do remember that might be of some interest to your project?

Elwood was assigned to Pope A.F. Base in North Carolina in 1962. It was there he received his training as a Flight Engineer on the C123. While there, he spent six months T.D.Y. in Da Nang at a time when most of us had never even heard of Viet Nam or what was happening there. It was there he received the Air Medal.

The whole squadron was transferred to Hurlburt Field (then known as Eglin Auxillary Field 9). This was in March of 1964. Elwood served as a Flight Engineer Instructor attached to the Royal Thailand Air Force from May April through October of 1964, then returned to Hurlburt.

In 1965 the squadron was split with half of them going to England A.F. Base in Louisiana and the rest staying at Hurlburt as an operational outfit. Elwood helped ferry the planes to and from Montgomery, Alabama to have them outfitted with the spray equipment. He flew spray missions in Texas and Mississippi.

In 1968, after training many Flight Engineers for service in Viet Nam, Elwood was transferred to Ranch Hand at Ben Hoa. I have included copies of his orders receiving the Purple Heart, Air Medal with clusters and the Distinguished Flying Cross. I do know he was there in time for the Tet offensive.

One incident he told me about; shells were incoming and they were trying to get the planes off. They heard an inbound close by and he and the co-pilot went out the back door and the pilot tried to go out the front. They were hit by shrapnel and the pilot was very seriously wounded but Elwood doesn't remember his name.

I have just asked Elwood some more questions so some of these answers will be out of context.

On missions, he said he flew 2 a day for six days a week but he has no idea of how many hours he flew. He did see one of our planes catch on fire, crash in the water and none of the crew survived.

Elwood was in Ranch because he volunteered to go there. I have already

told you of his training. He said he has no happy memories of Ranch. He didn't think anyone liked being over there and the only happy memory was coming home. (XXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXXX)

Elwood lived in quarters where there were 2 men to a cubicle and that is all he said about it.

He did say there were lots of parties but he wouldn't say anything more than that.

I am sorry we couldn't be of more help to you and I wish you much success on your project.

THE DISTINGUISHED FLYING CROSS

TO

ELWOOD L. SMITH

Staff Sergeant Elwood L. Smith distinguished himself by extraordinary achievement while participating in aerial flight as a UC-123 (Deselation) Flight Engineer near An Hoa, Republic of Vietnam, on 29 May 1968. On that date, Sergeant Smith encountered an area of intense automatic weapons fire and his aircraft sustained seven hits causing an engine to fail. Displaying great calm under fire, Sergeant Smith marked the positions of hostile fire and provided the aircraft commander with a timely battle damage assessment. In order to lighten his stricken aircraft, Sergeant Smith was forced to initiate emergency dump procedures when the electrical dump system failed. The professional competence, aerial skill, and devotion to duty displayed by Sergeant Smith reflect great credit upon himself and the United States Air Force.


