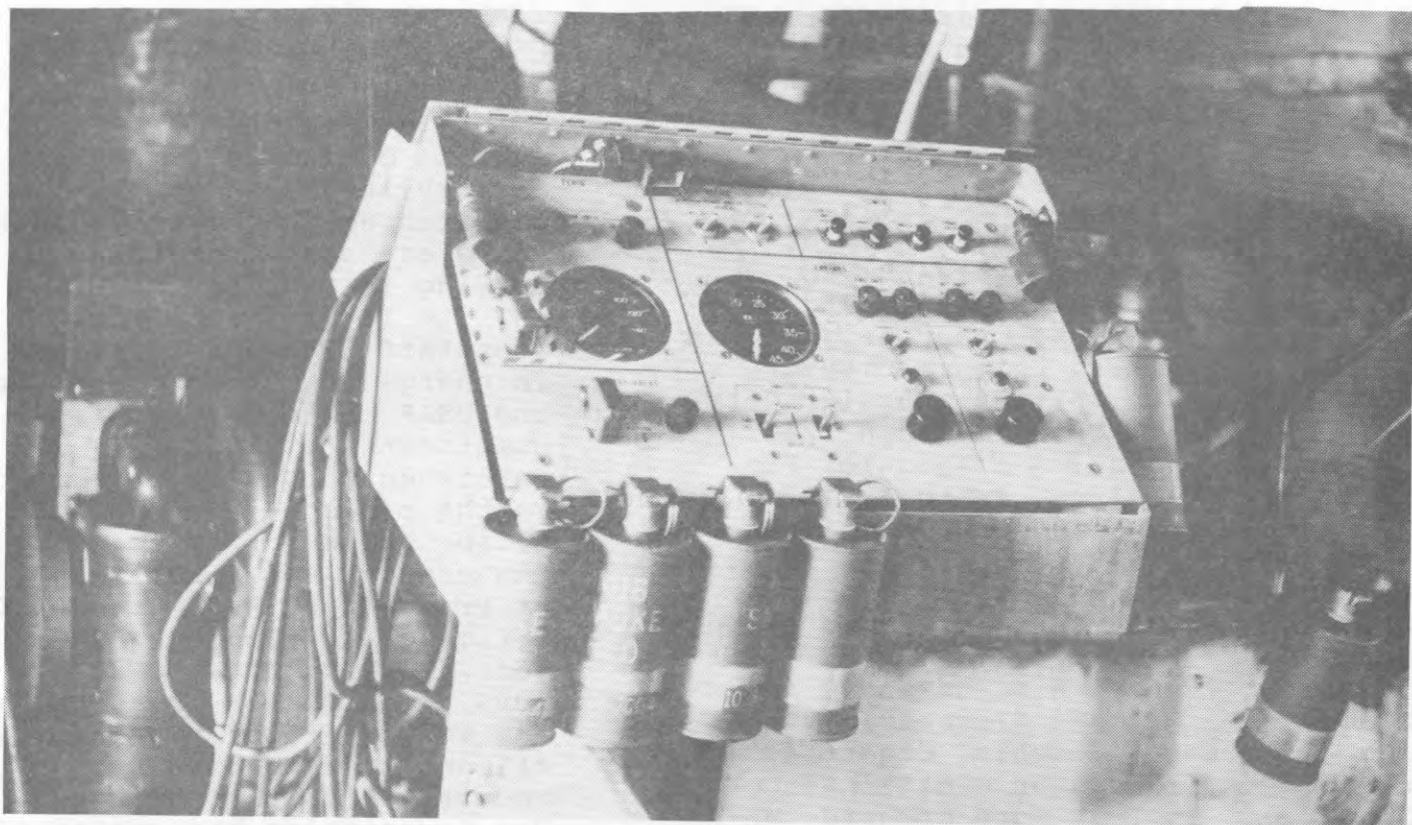
The Air Force Health Study:

In May of this year each of us should have received an executive summary and an abstract of the conclusions resulting from the 1987 physical examination administered by the Scripps Research Foundation in La Jolla, CA.

As in the previous morbidity examination, Science Applications International, Corp., Scripps Clinic and Research Center, and the National Opinion Research Center found relatively few health differences, and none of major medical relevance when comparing Cowboys and our comparison group. Minor statistical differences were observed. The only significant medical difference was an increase in basal cell skin cancer, often associated with sun exposure and easily treatable. No increases were evident in the occurrence of systemic cancers (serious cancers). The higher frequency of this cancer will be studied more closely as the Health Study continues.

Most of us also received a letter from the School of Aerospace Medicine (Dr. Wolfe) providing us with our current body burden of dioxin in parts per trillion. As the Air Force Health Study has progressed over the past 9 years, science has progressed as well, and the Centers for Disease Control can now measure dioxin content in anyone's blood. It is no surprise that Ranch Hand personnel as a group have more of this chemical in our blood than that of our comparison group. It is also important to note there is currently no known relationship between human health outcome and dioxin levels of this minute amount.

A small number of the Ranch and Comparisons were not informed of their individual dioxin level due to quality control problems with blood samples in transit, contamination in handling, laboratory problems, etc. For those of us in that category it's back to the Vampire Room in '92!
