Dear Philly Folks:

Once again, Hi to all...Lots of little items to bring you up to date on but at the moment I can't think of anything earth shaking that has happened since the last PF letter.

Quaker mobility: Has improved with the addition of one small "duck egg white" Honda truck to the stable. For those of you who may have been worrying about the crew that was to drive the new vehicle from Saigon to Quang Ngai; you can stop now. Lou, Lady and Pete did the honors and made the trip with no major problems in three days. They left Saigon on a Sunday morning and plowed through the heavy rains towards Dalat, arriving there just before dark. They were only slightly humiliated by having to have a truck pull them out of the deep mud a couple of times. Guess those Honda trucks just aren't good "mudders". They stayed over night at the VNCS house in Dalat and the next morning pushed on to Nha Trang where they spent that night also with VNCS... (That nice seaside resort,, Remember, Marge?) Tuesday, they came right on thru, coming in the Quang Ngai gate just in time for dinner around 6ish. The little vehicle is great.. Tiny but strong and for the moment, sharp looking. Ever since it arrived, the poor old citroen and volkswagen have been cowering in a remote corner of the yard, feeling completely upstaged. Grin... The citroen is hanging on, but just barely. Any day now, we might begin seeing a little bit more of them. Grin.... All is well and as far as we know there are no more "secret alliances" in the offing. Well....Thats not exactly the truth but I'm not at liberty to say..... (Sorry Friends...)

Mike, Eliz & Dudman: Surely you all know by now that the three journalists (Mike Morrow, Eliz. Pond and Richard Dudman) have been released and are safe and well. That was great news...Eric sent off a cable soonest welcoming Mike back to this side...It's just too bad that the poor CBS fellows were lucky enough to be captured alive. This makes it look more hopeful for the rest of the newsmen still missing. Make you homesick for the "action", Marge?? Grin....

Social work students: The two young girls from Caritas left us today. We are really going to miss their energetic and cheerful personalities around here. They seemingly did a fine job. If they had nothing else on the ball (and they did), their enthusiasm would have carried them a long way. Eric formally presented them with certificates of appreciation today at noon which immediately reduced one of them to tears. They return to Saigon to study ~~at~~ until October at which time they will be finished. One of them is toying with the idea of coming back up to Quang Ngai to work with us. We shall see.

Quaker Menagerie: We still haven't managed to get the pony that Marge wanted or the ducks that Rog wants or the bunnies that I'd like but on all other fronts we seem to be doing fine. First it was old Minh Phi (Definitely not your kind of dog, Jack!), Vietnamese type mutt... Tense, hyperactive (at times) and blind as a bat in a hail storm.....Loving but at the same time, independent...Loves to go for rides in the citroen and will race you back. Getting a reputation about town as the fastest near-sighted hound on his four feet. Then there came Bac-Si; lumbering moose type animal, all mouth and feet, loving Mortimer Sheard type puppy..At 3 months is several inches taller than Nein Phi and many pounds heavier..Phi's only defense now is that he can outrun Bac-Si without even working up a sweat. Well, two dogs is fun..We really enjoy them...But the straw that broke the camel's back was a couple nights ago..Co Van (Anh An's girl friend) brought the tiniest grey kitten you ever saw to Roger. Both dogs went wild and drove the kit behind the fridge for 24 hours..But after that the kitty took over and in three days has both the dogs trained perfectly. Eric talked to him a bit and I guess told him to go over to the center and fill out a application. The boy went out and not 10 minutes later he had disappeared with Bich's Honda. Later we managed to piece the story together. Bich had the key to the honda in his pocket. He is always meticulously careful. The boy had left his name and address (false) with Eric and then went out into the yard. He walked to the gate and stood there a bit leaning against a gate post... I saw him there and so did Lady as she drove in. Then he apparently went over to Huong and told him that his brother had brought his honda into the yard (was Bich's honda but Huong didn't know that) and had gone off with the keys. Good business to hire the handicapped : Seems to me I have heard that said somewhere...We have just added two more amputees to our staff and are about to fire one...Does that make our batting average better or worse? We hired Mr. Da, a single above knee amputee, as night watchman of the hostel but he has turned out to be something less than satisfactory so it looks like he will be leaving soon. He caused something of a moral dilemma in our ranks as just before it was decided that he would have to go, he invited Eric, Keith and some of the others to a feast at his house. Well, knowing that we were going to sack him, should one go to the feast or not? Grin...Such a decision. It was finally decided that the invited would go and the firing postponed a week.

One of the newly hired was an amputee who had already trained as a prosthetic technician in Saigon and had worked at the rehab. center in DaNang for awhile. It turns out that he had been let go from DaNang due to unpopular (and unhealthy??) political convictions or some such thing. We hired him...Naturally!! Grin.... Then another amputee who had recently received his artificial leg was signed on as a new student of prosthetics. He is just starting and Roger hopes to have him to a level of proficiency where he can function with the help of the more experienced boys by the time Roger leaves in December. With Lieu, that makes 3 technicians that are amputees. We are sneaking up to that quota...

Chuck, the Surgeon: Wow, this fellow really puts out. Being constantly frustrated at being unable to schedule an operating theatre for his elective surgery, he revamped his little office a bit and is now doing most of his surgery there with Mr. Bich's help. Anything that can be done under local or spinal anesthetic goes. Skin grafts, stump revisions, excisions, tension releases...Its exciting. Bill and Bryl meet up with a problem with one of their patients that is holding up progress...They snap their fingers twice and presto...Chuck takes care of it. Grin..Well, its not quite that easy but almost. Bev is cheif nurse with the blood pressure cuff, etc and Bich is assisting in some cases. He is even doing skin grafts now and Chuck lets him sew up a lot of the cases. Bich, of course, is enjoying all this tremendously and Mr. Ry is just a mite jealous. Grin...When Chuck is going to operate in his office, he and Bev make up the pack of instruments and drapes and what not and send it to the main building to be sterilized. The office has been screened well and a tight door between the P.T. dept and the office. Triem has special instructions to scrub the "theatre" down with antiseptic each day...Sometimes he even does it! Grin...Things have worked out very well and at almost no outlay of money for extra equipment. Chuck has proven a past master at worming his way into the warehouse and finding anything he needs.
