Illini Fencers 2nd In NCAA Meet

The Illini fencers once again were nosed out of a possible National Championship. Fencing at Ohio State, the team, led by Capt. Howie Boland, were rated second by 1½ points. Northwestern came in first with 28½ points.

The National Championships, held yearly, is participated in by all college teams of the nation. Capt. Howie Boland, former Big Ten Epee champion, came in first in the epee division and is rated as the National Epee Champion.

Warren Malik came in second in the individual foils, losing to McNamara of Northwestern University. McDonald, sabreman, was qualified for the semi-finals but did not place among the leaders. Friduss, fencing foil, and Sawin, fencing epee, missed getting into the finals by approximately 2 points each.

Participating in the meet besides Northwestern and Illinois, and placing respectively were: Washington U., Ohio State, Chicago, Michigan State, Kentucky, Case, Wayne, Wisconsin, Notre Dame, Dartmouth, Lawrence, Oberlin, Ohio U., Washington, Yale, Rutgers, and Dennison.

The Illini completed their season with nine wins, two losses and one tie, which is the best record of any college in the country.

Coach Mac Garret anticipates having one of the best teams in the conference next year although Capt. Boland will graduate this year.
